#### The Gift of Lenience

Changing ourselves is hard. Sometimes we do not even see what should be changed. But we can usually see what others should change. Their foibles are all too evident.

Given the power, what would you change about the world around you? The way people act, the policies of institutions,



the evil thoughts that darken the minds of criminals—these and more may annoy us and add misery to our lives. If we had the power, surely we would change other people.

So, why doesn't God do this? God has the power to change other people. Doesn't God see injustice? Doesn't it annoy the divine presence?

The Book of Wisdom wrestled with these questions long before we did. It says that God could establish justice merely by the use of unparalleled might. Instead, God is lenient. The God who has power over all things is lenient with evildoers.

When we think of the sins of others, such leniency seems foolish. But when we think of our own sins, such leniency is gift. According to the Book of Wisdom, God's tolerance of the wicked does not show indifference. Rather, it gives hope to those who would repent.

#### Are you 70 and ½ or older? Do you want to save on federal and state income taxes?

Giving directly from your IRA to a qualified charity like the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Annual Catholic Appeal, diocesan or parish ministry can be a tax-wise strategy. If you are a Senior required to take a Minimum Required Distribution from your IRA, you can transfer your contribution directly to the charity. This is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution and it reduces your income by the amount of your contribution. By reducing your income not one penny of your charitable contribution goes to taxes. ## NAVIGATING THE HOUSING MATRIX

Income Qualified This week, I've been trying to find housing for a guest who was released from the hospital Tuesday after spending three weeks in the ICU due to being stabbed and left for dead.

Taylor is recovering slowly; his time at the hospital was up, though he doesn't have the strength to look for housing. Luckily, he was granted a housing voucher just before he was mugged and that voucher remains valid. Still, he has to navigate the task of finding a place that will take him, with his past and with his homeless status. The process is daunting and the hurdles high. As I'm helping Taylor, I am learning so much. Our system is overloaded, social worker caseloads unbearable, and opportunities to find felonyfriendly landlords few.

While I visited him in the hospital and we began talking about a place for him, he said, "I really, really want to be as close as possible to the Public Gold Dome; there is something special.

Being born and raised Catholic, it's just part of who I am. I need to stay close to God and the Church."

Pray we are able to help Taylor find a place quickly, for him to stay long on the streets would be too much physically and emotionally. Once we find a place for Taylor, let's work together to furnish the place as he has nothing and no family.
