Acts of God

There is a legal term for a natural disaster.



It is called an "act of God." It is a little unfair to libel God with deeds of destruction. Even so, when the forces of nature reveal their strength, people become aware of their own weaknesses and meditate on the power of God.

But when people go in search of God, they rarely go to the place of an earthquake, a fire, or t ornado. They go to a quiet place. They watch the sunrise. They pick a wayside chapel. They sit by the ocean. They find God's majestic voice in whispers of peace.

When Elijah fled the grasp of the angry and murderous Jezebel, he eventually found himself in a cave on the mountain of God, Horeb. There he witnessed God passing by. Not in the strong wind, not in the earthquake, not in the fire did Elijah behold God's presence, but in a tiny whispering sound.

Noise surrounds much of our day. The radio or television breaks the morning silence. Ambient music filters through elevators and grocery stores. Our cars cannot block out the cacophony of traffic.

It may not take an act of God for us to be able to find God. It may just take a quiet space.

Cathedral Campus Facility Updates

Several parishioners have inquired about the ongoing needs of our Cathedral facility. Below are updates on ongoing projects.

ELECTRICAL

Two weeks ago Fr. Paul mentioned in the announcements that we had a potentially

dangerous issue with the transformer which runs our extensive lighting system. We are happy to announce that Mark One Electric has determined that replacing the entire system (which was the big, expensive fear) is not necessary. The temporary fix is working well,



though a permanent fix is forthcoming within the next couple weeks. The permanent fix will be a few hundred dollars, rather than several thousand for a new transformer. We thank Mark One for giving a discount too!

AUGUST MAINTENANCE

Sump Pump, Rectory: A replacement pump is necessary to prevent the basement of the rectory and offices from more flooding. Our campus has seven sump pumps, and can use at least a couple more.



<u>Windows</u>: One window vandalized at MGM has been replaced, two more single-pane windows need to be replaced.



<u>Filters</u>: Look at that yuk! No longer will we allow our filters to go so long between changes. All 75 filters on campus were changed this past week. Quarterly filter changes cost \$368.

WATER WOES


Our much used O'Hara Meeting Room has been taking on water during heavy rains, and has become much worse recently. The water has saturated the lower cabinets and drywall in the kitchen and a significant section of the meeting room.

Currently, large dehumidifiers are at work drying everything to prevent mold.
Our insurance will take care of removing all the water-damaged items. Then we can accurately find and cure the cause of water entering the building so that we might then rebuild; the cost of rebuilding cabinets, drywall, and flooring is ours.

The process will take several weeks.

UP TOP: Roof & Finial

We are continuing to receive bids to replace some roof tiles blown off in storms, and we are also planning for the long-term replacement of the roof.



As part of the project, some other painting and care will need to be taken care of.

Thankfully our air conditioning system has been running well this summer and keeping things cool. There are necessary updates we wish to make to our programming and other small needs indicated from the professional inspections done each quarter.
