

Are some of your shares of stock or mutual funds higher than when you bought them? This provides you a wise method of giving to Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. Donating appreciated stock or mutual fund shares is a strategic gift-planning method. In most cases, the donor receives an itemized deduction in the full amount of the fair market value (FMV) of the shares donated as of the date of the gift. This value is deductible up to 30% of the donor's adjusted gross income and can be carried over for up to five years after the year of the gift. Please consult your financial or legal adviser.

Waiting for the End

St. Paul was wrong about one thing. He thought the world was coming to an end rather quickly. It's nearly 2,000 years later, and we're still waiting.



But he was right about this: A good Christian lives as if the end were coming soon. We should live every day as if it were our last, ready to greet Christ when he comes again. After all, we don't really know when that might be.

Paul's advice sounds a little odd: If you're married, act like you're not. If you're crying, don't. If you're rejoicing, stop. On the surface it doesn't make much sense. But Paul's point is that we should have other concerns. "The world in its present form is passing away." So don't put all your time, effort, and emotions into it. Think about the things of the next world. Do the things that will please God.

In truth, most of us act as though we'll live forever. We buy and hoard. We roam from one emotional relationship to another. Paul would have us settle our hearts on other things. Make the world more livable for someone else.

As we wait for the end, we take the world in stride. So what if the weather is bad, the car won't start, or the kid next door dyed his hair green? The world in its present form is passing away.

OUT OF THE COLD

There is a new cold-weather shelter in downtown for the homeless. Named after Scott Eicke, one of those who froze to death a couple weeks ago, the shelter is a community center owned by the City of KCMO.

It will be open when the temp drops to 32 degrees. On Friday night, MGM delivered several sleeping mats, sleeping bags, and other essential items to help the shelter start off right.

Other than the two main shelters in town, City Union Mission and ShelterKC, there is also the KC Dram Center in KCK, 1500 Central Avenue, open when the temp drops to 20 degrees.
