

Going Away

A lot of families can tell a story like this. The oldest child had a strong character, and younger siblings seemed to pull back when the kids were all together. Even at school, younger siblings lived in the shadow of the oldest.

But then the day came when the oldest child moved on to another school. Almost overnight, the younger children began to develop personalities of their own. They took on more responsibilities and became more independent. It wasn't that the oldest child tried to hold the other children back. But once the older child was gone, the others felt more freedom to grow their own way.


When Jesus ascended into heaven, the disciples had to step up and take responsibility

for the church he left behind. They had been fearful, ignorant, and inept through the previous years. But now they became a force to be reckoned with—strong leaders, eloquent speakers, and workers of wonders. Jesus had to leave for all this to happen.

The Letter to the Ephesians says that Jesus "ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things." He went away in order to be more present. He became more present especially in his disciples, who developed a multitude of gifts. "He gave some as apostles, others as prophets, others as evangelists, others as pastors and teachers."

HEROES AMONG US

A little over a week ago, **Jeremy** brought to breakfast a wallet that he had found on the street in downtown KC. He communicated with Steve (who speaks sign language, Jeremy is deaf) that he had no way of getting in touch with the owner but that maybe someone at MGM could find her. The owner was from out-of-town, Wichita, and the wallet was full of those important documents that we all fear losing. Surely, the owner was frantic searching for the wallet.



One of our volunteers got to work researching and quickly we were able to find a phone number and make the call. Later in the morning the owner and wallet were reunited.

A few days later, the owner had to come back. She just had to leave an envelope with a small reward for her hero. Jeremy came again to breakfast and was excited to receive this unexpected token.

Will also is a

hero, for our Cathedral and for me. There is always a lot going on in the Cathedral. Last Monday, we had contractors working and a diocesan crew filming inside. With Angelica on vacation, I was supposed to do a walk-thru in the late afternoon to button things up; I forgot. Will told me Tuesday morning he found the front doors of the Cathedral unlocked Monday evening. He stepped inside, locked the door, then checked the bathrooms to make sure no one else was in the building, then he made sure all the doors were locked and left through the south door.

Some people take advantage of situations, benefitting personally from someone else's bad luck or mistakes. Others, like Jeremy and Will, do not. These are men



of integrity. Despite being poor, despite being homeless, despite being rejected by the vast majority of society, their integrity remains firmly intact.
