Fearing or Taunting Death

The fear of dying haunts our days. We treasure every day we have, with all its joys



and sorrows. But our fears can cause bad choices. We spend more on ourselves than on our neighbor. We seek our pleasures above those of others. We want as much from life as we can get, as if our happiness comes from things that pass away.

But God created us as eternal beings. We can receive eternal happiness if we think of others, not just ourselves, and if we strive to do God's will, not just our own.

Death carries a sting. It can cause bad choices. The fear of death can lead to sin. But through Jesus, God has removed the sting of death. God has given us a victory, a promise of salvation. St. Paul shared with the Corinthians a song that taunted death: "Death is swallowed up in victory. / Where, O death, is your victory? / Where, O death, is your sting?"

Today we celebrate the Assumption of Mary into heaven. We believe that God received Mary into heaven as a sign of the promise in which we all share. Mary was created for an eternal mission. She lived her life with eternal values. She lives now eternally, forever with God.

Mary helps us put away our fears of dying, to live for others and to do the will of God. She helps us make good choices that lead to everlasting joy.

On August 5, I wrote a check to the DMV so Anthony could get his Missouri State ID and so be ready if he was offered a job. I'm always pleased we can offer this service to our guests as it usually means they've begun the long journey to get off the streets. The \$18 is a small gift we can make, thanks to our donors and our church, to help get this critical identification card.

So I was surprised on Tuesday morning when Anthony handed the check back to me. I assumed this meant the DMV needed some more information from him; however, Anthony told me that over the weekend he was offered a job and that the employer was going to wait until after the first paycheck to verify his ID. This would give Anthony time to pay for his own ID.

He handed me the check I had written a few days earlier and I started to tell him that we are still happy to help with this small fee. He stopped me and said, "I was raised to pay for things on my own if I can, I can do this and so I don't need this kind check. Please make sure someone else who needs it more can use it." My only answer of course was "Yes, Thank You Anthony."

LESLEY'S NOTE

Despite attending Catholic school, becoming a teacher, and leading 5th graders for 16 years, sometimes forces outside our control bring everything to a halt. Lesley left a note after she received MGM services, sad about the brain blood clot that led her out of teaching, sad that her family wants nothing more to do with her, sad to now be sleeping on the streets. But her handwritten note was filled with thanksgiving: "Thanks you for your donations and the volunteer work you are doing." "I hope I didn't upset you." "I think people forget your hard work, I don't."

CAR STOLEN

Each Friday Danny delivers food to MGM. He pulls up to the Broadway entrance, his large dog in the car with him (Baxter weighs 175 lbs). When Danny got out of his car last Friday, a homeless guest jumped in and took off with the car, and Baxter! This shocked all of us of course, most shocked was probably the thief, who let Baxter out a few blocks away. Baxter was found soon after, and the car over the weekend.

At MGM, we see people at their best and at their worst. We try to love and not judge.
