



The Challenge of Love


One of the most popular readings at weddings is this passage from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians: "Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous. It bears all things. Love never fails." It is a beautiful hymn to love, and it captures the emotions that many couples feel as they celebrate their wedding day.

But Paul did not have marriage in mind. He was writing about the early Christian community in Corinth, the equivalent of a parish today. The members had many gifts. They were not using them well. They were divided in their sentiments. They said they believed in Jesus, but they were not acting the way he

taught. Jesus wanted everyone to love God and to love their neighbor. That was not happening in Corinth.

So Paul reminded them what love is—and what it is not. "It is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing." The Corinthians were guilty of all these things.

Paul would probably be surprised to know that this passage was used so often at weddings today. He would probably remark, "OK—but just remember. If this describes the love of a newly married couple, that is the kind of love you should have for everyone in your parish. Not just for one person."

At Seedtime: Celebrating a Diocesan Day of Prayer Friday February 4, 2022

Seeds represent a microcosm of all life. By our prayer, we acknowledge God's love for all creation and our responsibility to care for it. As planting season begins in late winter or early spring we the Church seek God's blessing on seeds, crops, and all creation. Gardeners, farmers, and all growers especially ask God's protection for seeds (or young plants) in fields, gardens, and greenhouses.

In the past, when the Church marked certain times of the year with Ember Days and Rogation Days, it included prayers for the <u>Blessing of Seeds at Planting</u> <u>Time</u>, as well as prayers for the <u>Blessing of Fields and Gardens</u>.

Our diocesan day of prayer occurs on Friday, Feb. 4, 2022. Parishes can celebrate God's gift of seeds as a microcosm of all life in several ways:

- Parish masses on Feb. 4 use the Roman Missal's prayers "At Seedtime" (#27 from Masses for Various Needs and Occasions). Blessing of seeds can occur in this context.
- Parish formation programs can use this insert from the Office of Divine Worship (https://kcsjcatholic.org/office/divine-worship), with groups of children or youth for sacramental prep or care of creation ministries.
- Households and small faith communities can use the insert on a suitable day later in the planting season.
- At the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on Feb. 4 (12:15 p.m. mass) Bishop Johnston will bless all seeds present. Seeds can be brought in person, or sent with someone ahead of time. Especially invited are gardeners, farmers, greenhouse growers, and all who work with plants or seeds.
