The Gospel in a Nutshell

Each Sunday we recite the Creed. This statement contains our most profound beliefs. If someone asks what we believe, we might otherwise stammer and sputter. But we can always say what we have received, the Creed.

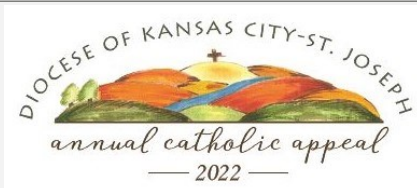
Other examples of early creeds can be found in the New Testament. One is in Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. He says it is a statement he received from someone else, so it was already part of the Church's tradition in the first generation after Jesus. He writes, "that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; that he was buried; that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures; that he appeared to Cephas [Peter], then to the Twelve."

So here it is: Jesus died and was buried, but he rose again and appeared to his closest followers. It all happened in fulfillment of prophecy, showing the plan of God's mercy reaching across the bands of time. That is the gospel in a nutshell.

Paul adds to it that Jesus made several other appearances, including one to a group of five hundred, and another to Paul himself. This is why Paul's faith was so strong. He personally experienced the risen Christ, and he believed in the significance of his dying and rising.

As do we. We proclaim it each week at church, and we live it each day at home, at work, and at play.

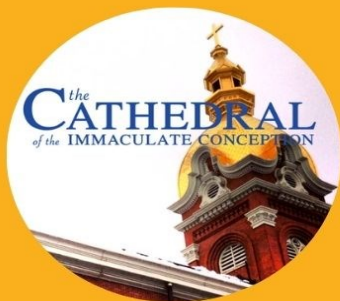
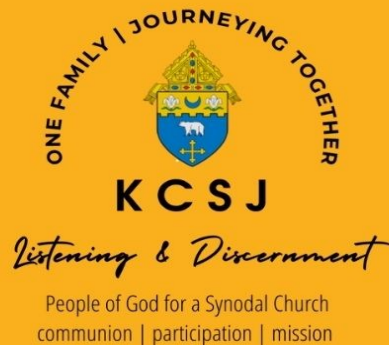

Loving & Serving the Homeless of Kansas City

“PICK UP YOUR MAT AND GO HOME”

The first thing I noticed when this man shuffled into Morning Glory Ministries for breakfast was his colorful striped mat made of plastic. It is something those who are sleeping on the street can acquire from Morning Glory.

More than providing a minimal cushion, it provides a barrier from the cold cement. It was 8 degrees outside the morning this picture was taken. After plopping the rest of his stuff on the floor, he grabbed a cup of coffee, removed his mask and minutes later fell into a deep sleep. He didn't even wake up when it was his table's turn to get in line for food.

If you look closely, you can see what appears to be a green hospital band around his right wrist. It's unclear whether his hospital stay was for physical or mental problems. Whatever the reason, as we know, one doesn't go to the hospital unless he or she is hurting.



There is a story in the Gospel where after healing a paralytic man, Jesus told him to “pick up his mat and go home (Mk. 2:11).” You wonder if the hospital essentially told this man the same thing. Unfortunately, he has no home where he can go. We appreciate your support that provides food, clothing and even mats for those in our community who are paralyzed in some fashion and in need of healing.
