Our Most Important Belief

Easter is the most important day in the year. Not everyone feels it. A lot of people treat Christmas with more importance. Or Valentine’s Day, or Independence Day, for that matter. But Easter tops the Christian calendar.

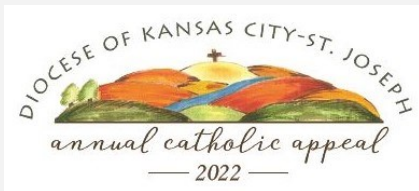
The reason, of course, is the meaning of the resurrection. Our belief in life after death directs everything we do. We live not as citizens of this world, but as citizens of heaven. We go about our daily tasks, but with one eye fixed beyond the horizon to a world yet to come. We believe we are forgiven and that a new home awaits us.

In Paul’s day, some of the Corinthians were having a problem with this. They questioned the resurrection of the dead. They suspected that death ended life, and that was that. Some of them believed Jesus had risen from the dead, but they did not go the next step, believing the same would happen to his followers.

To Paul, it made no sense. He wrote to the Corinthians, “If Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some among you say there is no resurrection of the dead?” The resurrection meant everything to Paul. “If Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain.”

With the resurrection of Christ comes forgiveness of sins and the resurrection of the dead. It is our firm faith. And it’s why Easter is the biggest day of the year.

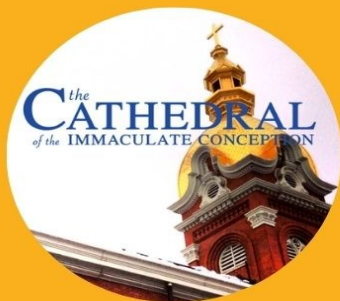

“SEND ME”

Last Wednesday morning at 6:30 the snow was falling and it was bitter cold. There was a man standing outside waiting to come in for breakfast. To get him out of the cold, we opened the door earlier than usual.

The first thing he said to me was, *Do you have a shovel?* Let me clean off the walk."

I grabbed a shovel and he went right to work.

When a need presents itself people respond in one of three ways: 1) Ignore it, 2) Wait to be asked to help, or 3) *Respond without being asked.*

This man chose response number three. It's probably the least often selected category when spotting a need.

More background on this story. This man is disabled. He later said he wanted to clear a path for a woman he saw coming down the street for breakfast. You can see her in the lobby getting warm while he continued work outside in the cold.

This man's offer to shovel without being asked reminded me of Isaiah in the first reading at Mass this past weekend. Isaiah said he heard God's voice asking for a volunteer and Isaiah said, *Send me.*"

When we see a need how do we respond? Ignore it? Wait to be asked? Or, like this man who came for breakfast respond without being asked?
