





## Second Sunday of Lent C 2 *Philippians 3:17-4:1*

#### **Changing into Glory**

Teachers have the special joy of watching students change. Right before their eyes, they see students begin the year one size and shape, and end the year with more knowledge, maturity, and life. They have a special role in this change, and they deserve all the thanks our society can give.

Change usually comes hard to us, but it is a necessary part of life. Some people, sadly, change for the worse. They meet the wrong friends and develop the wrong habits. They change their values and lose the respect of those who hoped for their future.



But when change is for the better, marvelous things happen. You grow in wisdom and understanding. You inspire others by your thoughts and deeds. And you reveal yourself as a true child of God, a citizen of heaven, growing more and more into the likeness of Christ.

Of course, the most dramatic change will come at the end. We will change from our earthly body into heavenly beings. Paul wrote to the Philippians, "The Lord Jesus Christ will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body."

Jesus demonstrated this hope in his transfiguration. Like a good teacher, he revealed the glory of God, a model for the change he has in mind for us. This Lent, let us not be discouraged by our sin, but encouraged by the vision of glory Christ holds out for us.



## **Morning Glory Ministries**

#### **Loving & Serving the Homeless of Kansas City**

#### "Perspective: How To See More Clearly"

"Do you have any shoestrings?" He asked. His boots were worn and weathered, much like him.

After eating breakfast at Morning Glory, people who are homeless can apply for "emergency assistance." Emergency assistance at Morning Glory means receiving some clothing and hygiene products. The requests that people make are very small. They ask for items like: a shirt, a pair of socks, a coat, toothpaste, a pair of shoes, underwear, or like this man, shoestrings.

These simple requests for help indicate the depth of their needs. The simple needs of those who are homeless put the "wants" that many of us have in perspective. For example, the frustration of having to wait a few extra minutes for one's meal in a nice restaurant *dissipates* when thinking about people who have so little and need so much.

It is easy to lose perspective. Even the apostles periodically lost it. In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus does something about that. He invites three of them up to the top of a mountain. On that mountain top these apostles saw Jesus "transfigured." They also had a vision of Moses and Elijah. They were amazed and said to Jesus, "It is good to be here."



Right before taking them up that mountain he told them that to follow Him they must be ready to deny themselves and pick up their cross. Surely, these were difficult words to hear, so He took them up there to give them *perspective on life and suffering*. Perspective can help one see that a crisis in life is not a life of crises.
