





## Third Sunday of Lent A (BC Opt.) 2 Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

#### Withholding Forgiveness

If someone offends you and apologizes, you are probably willing to forgive. But if someone offends you and never apologizes, you might withhold forgiveness.

You might do a favor for someone you love, or even for a complete stranger. But if someone has offended you and never apologized for it, you probably will not do a favor for that person. Offenders might think the wrong they've done wasn't so bad after all. You wouldn't want to take that risk.



You would not take that risk, but God would. God did. God did all of us a favor. God sent the only-begotten Son into the world to suffer and die so that we could have eternal life. God did this not for those who committed the least sin, not for those who fasted, not for those with the most service hours, and not for those who made the best grades. God did it for everyone. God even did it for sinners.

St. Paul tells the Romans that Christ died for the ungodly. "Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die."

How different God is from us. We would not give the time of day to people we know are sinners. Jesus gave his life for them. Jesus gave his life for you, no matter what you have done or how well you have apologized. God's love lies beyond human experience.

#### **Loving & Serving the Homeless of Kansas City**

#### "God's Occupation"

"Why doesn't he just get a job?"

This thought may cross into our minds when seeing a panhandler on a street corner. To use the metaphor about the fig tree in the Gospel reading this weekend, the beggar on the street may seem to not be "bearing fruit."

In his short story about a fig tree, Jesus says the owner of the garden wants to cut down a fig tree because it has not produced any fruit for three years. Seems like a reasonable idea on the part of the

owner.

If a fruit tree isn't bearing fruit, cut it down.

If a beggar doesn't work, ignore him.

If a friend or family member isn't behaving like we want them to, quit talking to them.



However, the gardener in Jesus' story, proposes another option. He says to the owner, "Give me a year to cultivate the ground and fertilize it." For the gardener, nourishment, not cutting down, is the solution for the tree that struggles to bear fruit.

Many of the homeless I have talked to at Morning Glory have been "cut down" or "cut off" from family. The reasons for this severance are no doubt many, but turning to family for help is no longer an option. So, they turn to Morning Glory.

Morning Glory Ministries, like the gardener in the parable, cultivates and nourishes those who come for help, knowing full well that it may take a year or more until they bear fruit. By providing meals, clothing and more, we come to know the guests and can help them grow.

Jesus said, "I am the true vine, and **my Father is the gardener**." (Jn 15:1) Fortunately, for all of us, God is in the business of cultivating, not cutting down.
