Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion ABC 2 *Philippians 2:6-11*

Extreme Life

On Palm Sunday we experience the greatness and the poverty of the human spirit. As Jesus entered Jerusalem, the crowds acclaimed him as the Son of David. But as he stood trial before Pilate, the same crowds called for his crucifixion

On Palm Sunday, near the end of Lent, we have come in touch with the greatness and poverty of our own lives. Throughout this season we have reflected on our sin, but we have also experienced God's grace in community, and scripture.



On Palm Sunday, we also hear about the greatness and poverty of Jesus. Jesus was in the form of God, but he took on human form. He had all greatness as God, but he did not cling to it.

St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians says, "Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave." Jesus humbled himself to become like us and to experience what we experience—even death. "Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name."

Sometimes in a single day we experience unfettered joy and inconsolable grief. A child is born, but someone dies. We receive mercy from a stranger, but we fail to love our neighbor. The extremes of human life are vast. But Christ came to us embracing both extremes and all that is in the middle. All, all of human life he redeems and makes his own.



Loving & Serving the Homeless of Kansas City

"A Pair of Jacks"

Jack Dunbar has been volunteering at Morning Glory for over 10 years. He is 83 years old. a retired attorney.

Jack Wheeler has been volunteering at Morning Glory for the past few months. He is 18 years old, a senior at St. Michael's high school.



If you lined up all of MGM's volunteers shoulder-to-shoulder *according to age*, these two Jacks would be quite a distance from each other. In between the pair of Jacks you would see men and women of all ages and stations in life: students, lawyers, nurses, business owners, moms, dads, retirees, laborers, managers and more.

Individually and as a group they are impressive. Regardless of the weather, even on the mornings that it snows, they show up! And they show up as early as 6:15 to serve people in need.

This coming week on Holy Thursday, most parishes will recreate Jesus' washing the disciples feet. It is a powerful symbolic action that calls us to be servants.

After washing their feet, Jesus said to his disciples, "I have given you a model to follow. As I have done for you, so you should also do." MGM volunteers by their actions bear witness to this final command of

Jesus. They also bear witness to the wisdom that "one finds joy in service."

One morning at breakfast, one of the homeless guest came up to two college students who were washing the trays used to carry the meals. He said to them, "I want to thank you for getting up early on a cold morning to come do this for us."

One of the students replied, "That's okay. It's no big deal."

He said, "No, it is a big deal. Were if not for you, all of us were not be eating this morning."

There's joy in service. It is a big deal. Happy Holy Thursday.
