



Second Sunday of Easter C 2 Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19

Sunday Vision

Easter puts behind us the hardships of Lent. Many of us accepted those challenges freely—we endured six weeks of penance in a spirit of contrition and with a desire for renewal. But some people do not ask for the difficulties they receive—hardships that are much more than any Lent ever induced.

For example, few people have to endure the kind of persecution that plagued the early church. Throughout the Easter season this year, the church invites us to hear several passages from the Book of Revelation, a book composed during a time of religious persecution. It inspired its readers to keep their faith strong and to press on to a brighter day.



At the beginning of the book, John says he shares the distress his readers endure. He found himself on an island—perhaps in exile—because he "proclaimed God's word and gave testimony to Jesus."

His vision took place on the Lord's day—Sunday. Although he was filled with fear, one "like a son of man" appeared to him and said, "Do not be afraid. I am the first and the last, the one who lives. Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever."

Whatever the troubles we face, our celebration on the Lord's day should grant us a vision that we have nothing to fear. The one who died now lives, and he will guide us through the days ahead.



"Invisible Wounds"



There was a man who came to Morning Glory whose face was covered with bandages. I asked him, "What happened?"

He said, "I was robbed two nights ago at gunpoint and was shot in the face. An ambulance took me to the hospital."

He face was still swollen, one eye nearly shut.

Occasionally, I have seen others come to MGM with a visible wound, like a black eye; however, most of those who come to Morning Glory have wounds that are **invisible**. You learn about these

wounds through conversations. For example, "I'm bi-polar." "I was just divorced." "I struggle with addiction." "I didn't have a good upbringing." "I'm all alone."

In the Gospel today the risen Jesus appears to the apostles. Remarkably, His wounds from the cross are still *visible*. In fact, to assuage Thomas' doubt that is it really Him, Jesus asks Thomas to put his hand in His wound.

Some have questioned why the risen Jesus still bore wounds, thinking his glorified body should be in perfect shape. So, why the wounds? What purpose do they serve?

Whenever we feel wounded, either by others, or when self-inflicted, it's good to talk to someone who has experienced the same wound as they can readily relate. It's why support groups are helpful as they gather around the same "wound": Alcoholics Anonymous, Compassionate Friends (for parents who lost a child), Divorced Groups, Grief Groups, and others. Sympathy heals.

The cuts on the body of the resurrected Jesus say to us, "Are you wounded? Take a look at mine. I understand." In other words, Jesus is in our support group. There's an upside to be wounded; it makes one sympathetic and more compassionate.

Fortunately for us, our Savior is a wounded Savior.


