



The Ascension of the Lord ABC 2 *Ephesians 1:17-23*

Power Source

Nations build up their power through politics, weapons and wealth. Strong leaders can unite their people to promote a cause. Mighty arsenals can overcome enemies. Money can buy influence and technology. Nations feel secure when they hold power.

As citizens, we sometimes take false hope in the security of our nation. It is nearly impossible to guard against every attack, to control every enemy and to protect our national treasures. It is tempting to rely on the standards of national power: politics, weapons and wealth.



The Letter to the Ephesians takes another view of power. It assumes that all power belongs to God, not to people, and that God has assigned authority to Christ, "raising him from the dead and seating him at his right hand in the heavens." God put all things beneath the feet of Christ "and gave him as head over all things."

But Jesus is no politician. He owns no weapons. He possesses no earthly wealth. His dominion differs from that of temporal rulers. Believers of every nation put their trust in Christ. They follow his teachings. Most importantly, they believe he is the victor over death. Jesus has conquered death, the enemy of every human. With Jesus as our head, we enjoy unparalleled freedom and release from all our fears.

Those who follow Christ put their trust in other forms of power—perfect love of God and neighbor.

I Don't Want To Come In Last

Years ago, a friend and I ran in the Hospital Hill Race, 7.7 miles. As we stood among the thousands of runners just minutes before the race, my friend surveyed the crowd as if looking for someone in particular. So, I asked, "Whom are you looking for?"

He said, "I'm just looking for someone I know I can beat. I just don't want to come in last."

It's human nature not to be "last." I read recently that the news-media shows more stories about victims than heroes, as viewers would rather see the former so that they feel that their own life is somehow better. Viewers, too, don't want to be last.

One way to feel superior is put down someone else, figuratively, to "throw stones." The first reading today is a story about a group of people who literally threw stones at St. Stephen, considered the first martyr of Christianity.

The people didn't like Stephen's message so they stoned him. Today, when people don't like what others say, they "stone" them on social media or by gossip.

Like my friend before the race, we may be tempted to see people who are homeless as those who will come in last, someone I can "beat." And we may be tempted to throw a few stones their way, "They're all lazy, or on drugs, or thieves;" instead of seeing them as people who are struggling.

Volunteers line up to serve breakfast each morning. Interacting with those who are different is how we become "one".

Throwing stones is easier than helping.

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus' final prayer on earth before his ascension is that we all might be one. In other words, we should not look for people we can beat; rather we should look for people we can help. That's how we become one.
