



The Reason for Gifts

Look around your church and you will see many gifts. You will see those who sing and those who read, those who preach and those who greet. You will see some who feed the hungry and others who serve on committees. You will see some who decorate and others who converse. Some have a gift for leading prayer, for parenting children or for making people feel at home. Everybody has some gift.

Still, not all gifts are equal. Some people excel at their gifts. Others exercise them less capably. The quality of the gift is not that important. It is important to exercise the gift, whatever its extent may be. The use of our gifts releases the power of the Spirit.

St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit."

God gives gifts for a reason. They are meant to be nurtured and used. The gifts manifest the Spirit. When used properly, they draw attention to God who gives, not to the person who has received.

The manifold gifts within one community show the marvels of the Holy Spirit. When people share their gifts, they create a spirit of selflessness and inspire others to service. They help everyone appreciate the goodness of God, who gives even before we ask.

When people look at you, they also see gifts. For which gifts are you most grateful? How do you share them?

Waiting to Talk, or Listening?

Every morning at Morning Glory guests line up for something to drink. The options are black coffee, coffee with cream and sugar, or water.

After asking which one of those options they want, it can often be a challenge to understand what a guest said. This is due to a number of reasons, 1) their voice is muffled by their mask, 2) English is their second language so it is heavily accented, 3) the ambient noise in the room, or 4) due to mental or physical illness a person's ability to articulate is impaired. Sometimes, you really have to listen closely to understand their answer.

This Sunday is Pentecost and the first reading describes the apostles in the midst of a large group of foreigners who are speaking various languages. To the apostles' amazement, they are able to understand what everyone is saying to them. "How does each of us hear them in their native language?" one apostle says to another. Understanding is a gift of the Spirit.

To be able to really listen and understand another person can be hard work, whether it is hard to *hear* for physical reasons, or hard to *understand* because we are not giving another person our undivided attention



In the movie "Pulp Fiction," there's a scene where Uma Thurman's character says to John Travolta's character, "**Do you listen, or wait to talk?**" He says, "I wait to talk, but I'm trying to listen."

We often hear that our country is "divided" today. Division, be it between citizens in a country, members in a family, or between people who are different than us, is the result of not really listening to one another. Most of us are "waiting to talk."

Jesus says that the inability to listen and hardheartedness go together, "People's hearts have become calloused; they hardly hear with their ears" (Matt 13:15).

As we learn from the first reading today, listening well to others is a gift of the Holy Spirit. A good place to start is to give our full attention to others when they speak, rather than "wait to talk."


