## There Goes the Neighborhood

**Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time** 

Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Where you live determines how you live. If you live in an apartment, you have to be mindful of your neighbors. If you share a homeowners' association, you have to follow its rules. Even if you have a private home in a gated community, you have to pay taxes and keep up with the bills.

Where do you live? No, not your address. Not the apartment number. Not your street or neighborhood. Not the town you chose because of its beauty or proximity to work. Where do you live? You live with Christ.

The Letter to the Colossians calls Christian brothers and sisters those who "were raised with Christ." And it tells them, in a beautiful phrase, where they live: "Your life is hidden with Christ in God."

Because we were raised with Christ, we live above, and we should seek the things that per\mathbb{I}tain to life above, not to life below. "Think of what is above, not of what is on earth."

We have a classy address. We live with Christ in God. Where we live determines how we live. We put aside the wants of the earth: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed. We adopt the way of freedom and unity. It's good for the neighborhood.

We are hidden with Christ in God. We are so close to Christ that when he, our life, appears, we will appear with him in glory.

## Loving & Serving the Homeless of Kansas City

## **Attachments**

"What's the hardest thing about sleeping outdoors?" I asked a 42 year old woman who had come for help from Morning Glory.

"Your stuff is constantly being stolen. Whatever you don't carry with you, there's a good chance that someone will steal it. That's why I have learned not to be attached to anything, then I am not bummed out when it's taken."

This woman probably doesn't it realize but she lives the Christian ideal of material detachment. She went on to tell me that when you get attached to things, they "trap you." Admittedly, she lives this Biblical ideal more due to circumstance than choice.

All of the Scripture readings this Sunday communicate a similar message: "This world is passing, don't get attached to material things, rather spend time on what really matters." The Gospel says, "Take care to guard against all greed, one's life does not consist of possessions."

Easier said than done.



How are we "to take guard against all greed?" The readings this Sunday say to remember that we will die, for example, the Psalm says, "Teach us to number our days correctly that we may gain wisdom of heart." There's an app called "WeCroak," that you can download for 99 cents. Five times a day it sends a message that reminds you that you will die. Allegedly, it helps one acquire that "wisdom of heart."

Another way that we can "take guard against greed," is to expose ourselves to people in need. Whether it's volunteering at a place like Morning Glory or spending time with someone you know who is struggling. Exposure to need teaches us to recognize what is really valuable in life.

The homeless woman and others who are homeless due to their hard life have had a Biblical wisdom forced upon them: "Don't get attached to material things, it's a trap." We can learn from them.
