





Stepping Out in Faith

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Hebrews 11:1–2, 8–19

Sometimes you go with your gut. You cannot reason why. You feel this is the right decision. You have thought and prayed about it. You have weighed the pros and cons. You cannot see on paper which is the right way. So you go with your gut. You step out in faith.

One of the greatest stories of faith is Abraham's. While he was living in Ur, contented but childless, God asked him to move. To entice him, God promised Abraham descendants.

On one level, it made no sense. If you can't have children in Ur, how could you have them in a foreign country? But something about that conversation with God moved Abraham. And Abraham moved.

The Letter to the Hebrews says, "By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inherination tance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go." Ultimately, it worked. God made good on the promise. Abraham received "descenndants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore."

We often think of faith as something irratio al, as what we have when there is no evidence. But Hebrews says something else: "Faith is the evidence of things not seen." We have faith because God put it there. Faith is evidence of God. It makes sense when nothing else does.

Loving & Serving the Homeless of Kansas City

"At an hour you do not expect"

After finishing breakfast, on their way out of Morning Glory, many of those who are homeless will make it a point to express their gratitude for the meal. One man was more emphatic about it than oth-

ers. He said to me, "I really want to thank you for this meal this morning. It was a blessing to start my day. When I get up in the morning, I ask God to bless me during the day. At the end of the day, I thank God for his blessings. This breakfast was my first blessing today."

I was impressed that this man, with ostensibly nothing to his name, begins and ends his day in prayer. His morning prayer puts him on the lookout for God's blessings through the day. My guess is that he sees them where others do not.

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus says be prepared for the "Son of Man will come at an hour when you least expect." He compares these surprise divine appearances to a thief coming in the middle of the night.

Jesus is saying a few things here: 1) God does visit us, and 2) God comes when you least expect it, (Reminds me of the lyrics from the Candid Camera show of the 60s, "When you least expect, you're selected...") and 3) be on the lookout for His visits.

This homeless man who expressed gratitude for the breakfast that morning knows all of this.

He **expects** God to visit him throughout the day. Consequently, he recognized the complimentary breakfast as God's first visit, or first blessing of the day.

Like him, if we start the day by asking God to bless us, expect it, and be on the lookout, we, too, will recognize his visits.

"You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." $(\rm Lk~12:40)$
