MEETING THE CHALLENGE



TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

CHebrews 12:1-4

Set your goals high. Thinking about them will bring you joy. But do not despair if they are hard to meet. Reaching your goals is always a struggle.

In Christian life, obstacles hamper our goals. But most of us are not facing the obstacles of the early church. Those Christians were persecuted for their faith. Some of them were tempted to abandon Christ. In their struggle against sin, some of them resisted to the point of shedding blood. That has not happened to most of us.

Still, sin tempts us in many ways. Many young people, for example, set high goals for themselves: not to abuse drugs, not to foster racism, not to have sex outside of marriage, not to commit acts of violence, not to drink and drive. But those goals are hard to reach. Temptation appears every day.

The Letter to the Hebrews says we can build up our endurance by reflecting on the persexverance of others. They shed the sins that kept them from their goals. "Since we are surxrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus."

He endured the cross, "in order that you may not grow weary and lose heart." Set your goals high. And meet them with Christ.

Getting Out Of A Hole

A guest coming to Morning Glory for help was wearing one of those large, hard-plastic, gray orthopedic boots on his right foot. I asked, "What happened to your foot?"

"Oh, a couple of nights ago two guys robbed me during the night and stole what little I had. I tried to put up a fight, but there were two of them. One pushed me down and the other jumped on my foot. It damaged it enough that I had to go to the emergency room."

Living on the streets is hard. Dealing with the inclement weather is one thing, susceptibility to physical harm is another. Sadly, the latter happens frequently. Many of those who come to Morning Glory have been robbed or literally beaten up.

For someone to move out of homelessness, it's like trying to get out of a deep hole. Lack of mental health services, lack of affordable housing, lack of social capital (knowing the right people) all make that climb difficult.

The first reading this Sunday is about a man in a hole. The prophet Jeremiah warns the people of Judah to repent lest they be punished by the Babylonians. The palace officials found Jeremiah's message demoralizing, so they asked the king to put him in an unused cistern to keep him quiet and eventually left to die.

A cistern back then was about 20 feet deep and held water that people could extract. The opening at the top was only about 2 or 3 feet wide. The one where Jeremiah was dropped had no water but had a muddy bottom. He was probably stuck in mud up to his knees.

A servant of the King pleaded on Jeremiah's behalf and the King changed his mind. He told his servant to round up 30 men and extricate him from the hole.

There may have been a time where we have found ourselves in that pit alone, seemingly no way out, looking upward hoping for release. Many of those who are homeless are currently in that pit.

Jeremiah was saved because he had an advocate. Even though he had an advocate it still took 30 men to get him out.

People who are homeless need advocates to push for more mental health services and affordable housing. They also need others, like the 30 men called upon to pitch in to help.

We may know someone who is in the proverbially "pit;" God may be calling us to be their advocate or, at least of to be one of the 30 who will pitch in.
