#### For Your Own Good

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Hebrews 12:5–7, 11–13



"You'll thank me for this one day." Oh, how a kid hates to hear those words. They often accompany some punishment that kids have to put up with until they get older. Kids seethe under those words. They do not make any sense. They take away fun. And they make them mad.

But those words are usually right. Maybe that adds to the frustration. We all hate to do what is "for our own good" when it feels like it is anything but. We do not like being told we did the wrong thing. We do not like to be punished. And we do not like being told to fix our attitude about punishment.

So when the Letter to the Hebrews says God treats us like children, it doesn't quite sound like good news. The author recalls a quote from the Old Testament. It is enough to make you wince: "My son, do not disdain the discipline of the Lord or lose heart when reproved by him; for whom the Lord loves, he disciplines; he scourges every son he acknowledges."

So, here is the advice we get: "Endure your trials as 'discipline." We would rather not have to endure trials at all. But when they come, we are supposed to endure them. "At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness."

We do not like hearing it, but it is true: Some day we will thank God for these trials.

#### Jail Break

"This may sound strange, but going to jail was the best thing that ever happened to me." A recently incarcerated man who had come to Morning Glory for breakfast and clothing said to me.

He didn't tell me what his crime was, but admitted that he was on a "bad path," and going to prison gave him time to think, pray and reorder his life. He had been in jail for three years.



I'm sure when he first went to jail that he didn't think it was the best thing to happen in his life, rather, he came to that revelation much later.

Though we may have not spent time in jail like the man who came to Morning Glory, we may have been "imprisoned" by guilt of a past deed, or sadness from a loss, or anger due to someone hurting us. In the second reading this Sunday, the letter to the Hebrews says that we should endure some of our "trials" in life as loving discipline from a caring parent-God. That can be hard to see at the time, but if we can see that, it can in some way become our "get-out-of-jail" card. To be sure, God does not want any of us to suffer, we know though that some suffering is part of life. Jesus is with us through everything we go through, all our suffering and our joys, our trials and our celebrations.

This past Wednesday, John was interviewing a guest who spoke about his seven years in prison and how much he missed his family. The guest is now in a halfway house and said that on his first day in the halfway house he was called for dinner, called by his first name. He broke down crying. The staff member asked, "Why are you crying?" He told her, "For the past seven years I've been called by my prison number, no one has called me by name in seven years."
