






The Voice of Authority

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Hebrews 12:18–19, 22–24a

Some people get intimidated easily. They are afraid to speak to the boss. They do not want to visit the principal's office. They may even fear a parent who still exercises power over the decisions children make.

What are people afraid of? Oftentimes they just do not want to be yelled at. The volume and tone in the angry voice of someone in authority is enough to shake you to your soul.

Moses had to face that voice. God was laying down the law and doing it loudly. When Moses visited God on Mount Sinai, he approached "a blazing fire and gloomy darkness and storm and a trumpet blast and a voice speaking words such that those who heard begged that no message be further addressed to them." It was so fearsome that the Letter to the Hebrews remembered this event over a thousand years later as if it had happened yesterday.

When Moses talked with God, he had to approach a fearsome scene on Mount Sinai. But not us. "No, you have approached Mount Zion." We see a different vision. We see "the city of the living God, . . . and countless angels in festal gathering, and the assembly of the firstborn enrolled in heaven, and God the judge of all, and the spirits of the just made perfect, and Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant."

We approach Jesus in prayer, not feeling intimidated, but privileged to enjoy the festal gathering of the just made perfect.

Doing Something For Nothing

Morning Glory provides a hearty breakfast to about 150 people, most of whom are homeless, four mornings a week. A typical breakfast is some kind of egg casserole, toast, fresh fruit, oatmeal and a cup of coffee. If you ordered these same items at First Watch, your breakfast would cost around \$23.00 (omelet with toast \$11.50, bowl of oatmeal \$8.00, cup of coffee \$3.50). Add on tax and a tip and you are close to \$30.00

Morning Glory does not charge anything for breakfast. It's free to those who come thanks to the generosity of donors who ask for nothing in return.

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus says when you have people over for a meal, don't invite family and friends, but rather invite people who are poor. In addition to helping out people who are hungry, Jesus has an interesting reason for saying this. He says that when you invite your family and friends over, they might in turn invite you over to their house and hence, you are "repaid." The poor on the other hand do not have the resources to invite you over, so in this case, you are not repaid. He goes on to say that those who *give without repayment* are "blessed."

It's human nature to give something and expect a return. I'll scratch your back if you'll scratch mine. Quid pro quo. Something for something. This for that. This kind of equal exchange is the underlying philosophy of capitalism. If someone asks us do a large favor for them we might ask or think, "What's in it for me?"

Jesus is presenting a different kind of "economy," where one gives without expecting something in return, especially when giving to someone in need. "When you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing," (Matt 6:3)

Giving without expecting in return in difficult, even within a family or between friends. We are ac-

customed to look for the scratchback. Jesus is calling us to higher level of helping, namely, giving something for nothing.
