TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Philemon 9-10, 12-17

The shortest book of the Bible is Paul's Letter to Philemon. It is only one chapter long. Paul became friends with Philemon, probably on a missionary journey. Paul probably stayed with Philemon, where he got to know a young fellow named Onesimus. Onesimus was one of Philemon's slaves.

Some time after they said farewell, Paul was arrested and landed in prison. There he continued his ministry of evangelization. He wrote letters to the communities and individuals he had met along the way.

One day Paul received a visitor to his prison cell. It was Onesimus! He had run away from Philemon! Paul continued to instruct the young man and probably baptized him. In prison, Paul had become the "father" of Onesimus.

But Onesimus had to go back. So Paul pulled out pen and paper and wrote a letter to Philemon on behalf of the runaway. "Perhaps this is why he was away from you for a while," Paul wrote, "that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave, but more than a slave, a brother." Paul signed the letter — a handwritten, autographed, original copy of one of the books of the Bible — and passed it through the bars of his prison into the humble hands of a runaway slave, who brought it home.

It is the shortest book in the Bible. But it has a big theme. If you can free someone else by writing a letter, do it.

Loving & Serving the Homeless of Kansas City

Suffering

"I'm not struggling, I'm *suffering*." Those were the first words out this man's mouth when I interviewed him for what he needed from Morning Glory's Clothing Closet.

He was in his 60s and was unexpectedly evicted from his residence. "I'm new at this," he said, meaning being homeless. He wasn't used to asking for help.

It's one thing to struggle, it's another to suffer. That's a distinction we can understand. Struggling is dealing with the "normal" day-to-day stresses. Suffering is more painful. Suffering makes us question the very meaning of life.

Reconciling suffering with a good, loving and all-powerful God has perplexed philosophers and theologians throughout the ages. Especially, when suffering strikes the innocent and people we see as "good." How can God allow this?

The first reading from the book of Wisdom this Sunday addresses this issue. It says that it's hard enough to understand the "things of earth," all the more so to understand the things of heaven. This reading admits that it is hard to understand God's "counsel" and his "intent." The writer of this reading prays for God's wisdom, to find meaning in the suffering.

In the book of Job we are told the story of man who really suffered, losing all, in spite of his goodness and innocence. Job cannot come up with a valid reason to explain his suffering. So, he adopts the wisdom from the first reading of this Sunday, that is, accepting his own limitations as well as maintaining faith in God. Job's prayer is, "Though you slay me, I trust in thee."



When we experience the pain of suffering, this reading from the book Wisdom and Job's prayer give us something to hang on to.
