#### **Guilty as Sin**

Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time
1 Timothy 1:12–17

Sometimes we are more guilty of ignorance than of sin. We did not know that we were offending someone else. We were not aware we were breaking local rules. We did not know we were hurting ourselves. We did not realize God would be displeased. We do not always mean to do something wrong. Sometimes we do the wrong thing out of ignorance.

Other times, though, we sin. We deliberately choose what is wrong. We talk ourselves into it for what seems like a good reason — it's eas lier, no one will know, it will be fun, I deserve it. But we choose what is wrong. We know it's wrong, and we do it.

At the time it may feel all right. But later we experience remorse. The guilt of our sins sits with us more than the enjoyment they so briefly extend. What can restore our peace?

Forgiveness. And that is why Jesus came. "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sin ners," says the First Letter to Timothy. Jesus did not come into the world to punish sinners but to save them. The author of the letter gives this personal testimony: "I was mercifully treated, so that in me, as the foremost, Christ Jesus might display all his patience as an example for those who would come to believe in him."

Whether we are guilty of ignorance or sin, Jesus has come to save us. This we believe. For this we give glory.

#### **Lost & Found**

"Necesito ayuda." He said. ("I need help.") This Hispanic man, looking to be in his mid-40s had recently arrived in Kansas City by bus from Oklahoma. He didn't speak English, his cell phone was stolen on the bus, he didn't know his way around. He had somehow found his way to Morning Glory.

He was really lost.


With the help of an interpreter, we learned that he was trying to get to a relative in Iowa. He didn't

have his phone, and he didn't know the number anyway. He was hoping to find some temporary work to earn money to continue his journey. We referred him to the Mexican consulate that is within walking distance from MGM.

In the Gospel this Sunday Jesus tells the parable of the shepherd who leaves the 99 sheep in the fold to seek out the one lost sheep. Jesus follows this short parable with the long parable of the Prodigal Son. Both are stories of being lost and being found.

There are many ways one can be lost. Geographically lost: no map or GPS. Psychologically lost: suffer from depression or some other mental illness. Occupationally lost: not sure where to work. Relationally lost: alone, do not feel close to anyone. Spiritually lost: not sure what life is all about.

In the short parable on the lost sheep, it's the shepherd who "goes after the lost one until he finds him." In the sto-



ry of the prodigal son, it's the younger son who is lost but then "comes to his senses" and returns to his father. When lost, there are times God finds us, and times that we come to our senses. Either way, the message of both passages is that God is thrilled and throws a party when the lost are found.

There may be someone in our life who is "lost." If so, as followers of the Good Shepherd, we should seek them out.
