Praying for Authority

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Timothy 2:1-8

Our list of people to pray for is pretty long. We pray for members of our family. We pray for friends. We pray for the sick. We remember the dying. We also ask God to care for the dead. We know people in financial trouble, parents with difficult children, and children with difficult parents. We even pray for our sports team to win. Whenever there is a need, we are happy to pray. We cannot always solve someone else's problem, but we can pray for them and lend our voice to the chorus appealing for God's ear.

The First Letter to Timothy thinks such prayers are a good idea. "I ask that supplica\text{\text{M}}tions, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone." So the Bible approves the idea of praying for others.

But it is a little surprising to hear what comes next. Next comes an example of whom we should pray for. It is not the sick. It is not the family. It is not even the poor. Prayers should first be offered "for kings and for all in author\mathbb{M}ity." Say what? "Kings and all in authority."

There is a reason: "that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity."

People in public office need our prayers more than we realize. We need them to govern so that they help us lead a tranquil, dignified life. When you pray for the needy, remember those in public office.

Two Masters

A man came to Morning Glory and said he needed help getting his birth certificate so he could apply for a job.

He was a friendly guy, about 60 years old. He shared his story with me. He said that he struggled with drug addiction and decided it was finally time to do something about it. So, shortly before this past Easter he decided to come to Mass to the Cathedral. He said, "I knew if I was going to start over, I would need God's help." He was homeless.

While he was out walking one day a woman stopped her car and asked if he wanted something to eat. He told her, "Sure." She drove to a nearby Quick-Trip and bought him a hot dog. She chatted with him and got his phone number.

During Holy Week she called him and asked if he wanted to go to church with her family and join them for lunch after. He said, "Sure."

He said he's been drug-free ever since he started this journey at the Cathedral. He was able to get into a small apartment and was getting ready to start a new job.



I told him that the message on the t-shirt he was wearing (see picture above) was a appropriate for his story. He said, "The lady that invited me to church and lunch gave it to me on Easter."

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus says, "You cannot serve two masters, God and mammon." We typically think of "money" when we hear the word mammon, but it could really stand for anything that draws us away from God and living a virtuous life. For this man, his "mammon" was drugs. He decided that day in the Cathedral to serve God instead of mammon.

There may be some "mammon" in our life that we serve that holds us back from God. This man's testimony is that once one stops serving "mammon" good things happen: a hot dog, a church service, a lunch, a t-shirt and a new life.
