Stirring the Flames

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Timothy 1:6–8, 13–14



We do not use all the tools we have. A computer can do much more than a typical user understands. Cell phones have more bells and whistles than people know about. Many of us do not know what to do with all the tools in the garage we bought, inherited, or that were left behind. We have more clothes than we can wear, more books and magazines than we can read, more television stations than we can watch. Our lives are filled with opportunity.

So are our hearts. God has given each of us a wealth of tools at our disposal. We have cleverness and concern, ingenuity and compassion, bravery and confidence — but we do not always use them.

The Second Letter to Timothy speaks of our spiritual gifts as something waiting to be stirred into flame. "I remind you to stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands." The Holy Spirit came to each one of us in Baptism and Confirmation, implanting the gifts of divine life in us like seeds. Or like sparks. They are ready to do the work that God intended them to do.

Those gifts lack only one thing. They need to be stirred. That is up to each of us. If we are moved by the needs of the world, we will move for the needs of the world. Stir your gifts into flame!



Two Bowls

Two bowls sit on my coworker's desk. One bowl holds rope-knotted rosaries, the other holds candy.

Each morning when she interviews those who are homeless who are in need of clothing or toiletries, they periodically ask her if they can have one of the items in those bowls. She said to me, "It's interesting. The requests for rosaries far exceed the requests for candy."

In the Gospel this weekend, the apostles ask Jesus, "Increase our faith." And Jesus tells them



that if they had faith the size of a small seed, they could command a tree to uproot itself or a mountain to move.

When we suffer, we desperately want that kind of power. We want to God to uproot whatever it is that causes us pain or move whatever obstacle in our life keeps up from going forward.

It is understandable why someone who is living on the street would ask for the rosary over candy. They struggle mightily to survive. Though they might not share our understanding of the rosary, they know it is an object that is spiritual in nature. Once they receive the rosary, they typically wear it around their neck.

When asked, "What does the rosary mean to you?"

One man who is homeless said, "It's a memento of God." Another said, "It's means 'protection'." Another said, "It means 'life'."

During each day we may find we have some quiet time, typically early in the morning or late in the evening. We, too, have a choice between "candy" and "rosaries." The "candy" might be watching TV, looking at Facebook, going over emails, perusing the internet. The "rosaries" are literally praying the rosary, quiet prayer, meditation, reading the Bible.
