Gliding into a Hole

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Timothy 2:8–13

At the end of a hard day's work, at the beginning of a tough month, in the middle of a difficult season — some people feel like quitting. But they cannot. They have to keep on working, even in the face of failure. Like rowers slipping downstream when they strive to paddle up, they see no progress. But if they stop, it only gets worse. Often it is debt that saps our energy. We get deeper into trouble, and there seems no way out.

Rule number one for getting out of a hole is simple: Quit digging. Even in the Christian life we all go through times of despair. Our prayer does not seem what it used to be. We are not as faithful at attending church as we would like. The feasts and seasons drift by without acknowledgment. Kindness to a neighbor seems unappealing.

Some people let their faith glide into a hole that seems unfathomable. They do not know what to do.

The Second Letter of Timothy knows what to do: "Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David." Jesus was the Son of God, but he was also human, a descendant of David. He was human like us. And he was raised from the dead.

Remember that. "If we have died with him we shall also live with him; if we persevere we shall also reign with him." He remains faithful to us if we open on hearts to him and remember.

For Mercy's Sake

"I know you all don't have to do this, that is why I am so grateful for the breakfast here."

A man who came for breakfast at Morning Glory said this to me before he left. The "you all" in his expression of gratitude refers to all the volunteers, donors and staff who make the breakfast possible each morning.

His gratitude was for more than just the meal. As he said, he knew that all involved at Morning Glory "don't have to do it." He knows that people who receive the meals at Morning Glory did not pay for them, nor earn them. The meals are a gift, one might say, a gift of mercy.

The word "mercy" suggests that something is done for another even though he or she doesn't deserve it. Someone who did something illegal and is subsequently brought before a judge may say, "I throw myself at the mercy of the court," meaning, "I know I deserve a harsh punishment, but I am asking for something less."

The Gospel this Sunday is the story of ten lepers who are healed by Jesus. It says that when they saw Jesus they "raised" their voices and said, "Have mercy on us." (Some versions say "have pity on us").



For some reasons, they must have felt like they didn't deserve healing, hence, their request for mercy. And as we know from the story, Jesus was merciful to them as he healed them.

Pope Francis' first book as pope was entitled, "The Name of God is Mercy." Pope Francis writes that "mercy is the first attribute of God."

Lepers in the Bible, and folks that come for breakfast at Morning Glory, are not the only ones in need of mercy, all of us do. We begin each Mass asking the Lord for mercy and not just once but three times!

It can be tempting to give people only what they deserve. That would be considered fair or just. The Gospel asks us though that we give more than they deserve, that we give each other mercy.
