Rumor Control

Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Thessalonians 1:11 — 2:2

Rumors are very hard to control. Once they are out they create their own truth. Even if they are not true, they create a suspicion that remains. It is not fair. With speedy communication, rumors can be challenged and falsified more quickly. But they also fly faster. And they can do a world of damage.


In the days of St. Paul, rumors traveled more slowly, but so did clarifications. It was very hard to get the right message out. This was especially challenging for the nuances Paul was trying to make.

For example, he believed that Jesus was coming back very soon, and people should behave accordingly. But Jesus had not yet come. Paul would have known about that.

In his Second Letter to the Thessalonians, Paul tries to put down a rumor that Christ had come, while promoting the idea that he was still coming. "We ask you, brothers and sisters, with regard to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our assembling with him, not to be shaken out of your minds suddenly, or to be alarmed either by a 'spirit,' or by an oral statement, or by a letter allegedly from us to the effect that the day of the Lord is at hand."

Some people will believe anything about the coming of Christ. We believe Paul. Christ may not have come today, but we live as if he will.



Up A Tree

Recently, I had conversations with two Morning Glory guests about their recovery from drug addiction. One said that after 10 days in detox he was able to "see things more clearly." The other said that after detox he was able "see myself as I used to be" and he didn't want to go back to being that person.

Both men used the metaphor of vision to explain their recovery.

The Gospel this weekend is about the tax collector Zaccheus who needed to "see" better. Tax collectors in Jesus' time had a reputation of cheating people to line their own pockets. Zaccheus was no exception. For whatever reason, Zaccheus decided he needed to see Jesus. Being small of stature, literally and figuratively, he climbed a tree. Climbing that tree was Zaccheus' version of detox. Most likely, he wanted to see Jesus because he knew deep down he needed to mend his ways.

Jesus sees him and invites himself to Zaccheus' house for dinner. After dinner, Zaccheus reforms. Instead of taking money unfairly from people, he gives half his money to the poor and declares that he would give four-fold back to those he extorted.

All of us could benefit from having a clearer "vision" of Jesus. **To do so, we could learn a lesson from Zaccheus and climb a tree**. The "tree" may be: more time in quiet prayer, reading the Bible, listening to a spiritual talk on a podast or Youtube video, reading a book about our faith, volunteering, giving to someone in need or to an organization that helps the needy.

Like a youngster who literally climbs trees, climbing up one of these figurative trees will give us a new perspective.
