If Only . . .
Third Sunday of Advent

Isaiah 35:1–6a, 10

We all have our own "if onlys." If only my hands didn't shake. If only my knees were stronger. If only I weren't afraid. If only we had enough rain. If only I could see more clearly. If only I could hear as I used to. If only I didn't feel trapped.

God understands. Even though life is not perfect, and even though our property and bodies deteriorate, God promises a restoration of all that is beautiful. The struggles of this life cause us to yearn for another, more glorious life.

Isaiah prophesies a day when God's glory will come. "Here is your God," Isaiah says. "God comes to save you." These words brought hope to those in exile, a people powerless and poor.

When Christians hear this text, we hear a promise that echoed all the way to the birth of Jesus. Jesus, whose name means "savior," is coming, and all will be made new in him.

Every time we strengthen the weak, help the needy, water the plants, or shovel the snow, we remove someone's "if only." We help them witness the coming of Christ.



Morning Glory Ministries December 11, 2022

Surviving When In A Desert

"How did you survive?"

I asked a 70 year old homeless man who had come to Morning Glory for help. He told me he had spent 19 years in prison.

He said, "It was tough. The prison I was in held some very violent people. Every day I feared for my life. I survived by praying. You had to. I prayed



every day. I never gave up hope."

The first reading this Sunday opens with an image of a flower that blossoms in the desert. A flower adapts to a parched desert by growing roots deeper to tap into ground water deep below the surface.

That homeless man in prison was like a desert flower. To adapt to his harsh conditions he prayed every day. As he said, "You had to." He also told me that at that time he was alone, there was no one else to turn to.

When we find ourselves in a proverbial desert we too must adapt by growing deeper roots to find ground water. Daily prayer gives internal strength to deal with the stress and gives one hope that eventually life will get better. It's how a 70 year old man said he survived his desert while in prison.
