






God's Signs

Fourth Sunday of Advent Isaiah 7:10–14

For Christians, the most famous prophecy of Isaiah is this: "The virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel."

Isaiah spoke these words to a king worried about the future of his dominion. God invited Ahaz to ask for a sign of favor, but Ahaz refused. In so many words, Ahaz did not want to put God to any trouble. Isaiah, exasperated, tells the king that God will give him a sign anyway. Whether or not Ahaz wants one, God will give a sign.

The sign Isaiah promises is a child born to a young woman. The child will be given a name that would carry a message to the king and his people: Emmanuel. God is with us.

When Matthew wrote about the birth of Jesus in the first chapter of his Gospel, he said it fulfilled this prophecy from Isaiah. Jesus is the sign that God is with us. The young woman, his mother Mary, conceived the child while remaining a virgin.

Where in the world do people not want to trouble God? How can you bring them a sign of comfort? No matter how impossible the situation might be, God is with us.



Signs, Signs, Everywhere A Sign

During the week at Morning Glory, people who are homeless receive help with clothing, hygiene products and personal identification (birth certificates and State ID). The staff interview them for their needs and, for record-keeping purposes, we ask them their name and date of birth.

My co-workers and I have noticed an inordinate number of people we interview that were born on December 25th. Whenever someone in need gives their birthday as Christmas, my mind quickly makes a connection between their poverty, the birth of Jesus and Jesus saying that he identifies with the poor, "whatever you do to the least you do to me." For my co-workers and me, it's a small sign of the presence of God.

The first reading this weekend begins with God telling Ahaz, "**Ask for a sign**." The prophet Isaiah in this reading declares that the sign of God's presence will be "a virgin conceiving a son who will be named Emmanuel."

A more formal word for a sign from God is a "*hierophany*," which literally means a "manifestation of the sacred." Most likely, you have had times in your life where you experienced a *hierophany*, where something happened that to you was clearly a sign of God's presence.

In the Gospel reading this Sunday we'll hear of Joseph having a hierophany when he experienced the presence of God in a dream. During the Christmas season in the Scripture readings at Mass, we will hear of others who experienced hierophanies: shepherds, wise men, Simeon and Anna.

The Christmas season is a good time to take God up on his challenge to Ahaz and "ask for a sign" that God is near. That sign may be something small and subtle, or large and obvious.

Ask for it, and then, look for it.
