






Christmas Mass during the Day Isaiah 52:7-10


Whenever you see something great, you can feel the excitement. Whenever you hear about something great, it just is not the same. Travelers give eyewitness accounts of their journeys, the people they have met, the places they have seen, and the events they have experienced. If something exciting happens on your street, you will want to see it for yourself. Then you can feel the excitement.

Christmas is a celebration for the eyewitnesses of salvation. We have not just heard about it. We have experienced it. We know the fulfillment of God's promises, the presence of Christ and the hope of believers. We have experienced the wonder of God in our families, our friends, our church, and our community. God is redeeming people.

Isaiah says, when those announcing good news about God come to the mountain of Jerusalem, they are beautiful to behold from head to toe. Even their feet are beautiful. "They see directly, before their eyes, the Lord restoring Zion." These eyewitnesses bring back to the city the exciting reports of God's work. It is not enough for us to hear about it. We look, see, and experience firsthand the marvels God has done.

This Christmas we reflect on God's action in our lives. We experience the birth of salvation within us. We know from our own experience that God saves us. When we share that good news, we are beautiful. Even our feet are beautiful.

# Walking In Darkness

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone." Is. 9:1

"How do you sleep outside when it is this cold?" I asked a man who had come to Morning Glory for breakfast when in was 20 degrees outside.

"Sometimes, I don't. Sometimes, it gets so cold you have to keep walking." He said. "It's why I'm so tired right now," he added.

The opening line from the first reading for Christmas midnight Mass is, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of



*gloom a light has shone."* People who experience homelessness literally walk in the darkness -- and the cold! Morning Glory literally provides light and warmth for them when the walk through its doors and figuratively provides "light" in the form of meals and clothing.

We all walk in darkness. We don't understand the purpose of suffering, especially the suffering of innocents like children. We don't understand the finality of death. We cannot see the next life and so may doubt its very existence. Sometimes we may wonder what the meaning of life is. As St. Paul writes about truly seeing God and reality, "*Now we see a dim reflection as in a mirror; later we shall see face to face.*"

Like a homeless person walking to stay warm on a cold winter night, we too walk in the darkness.

At Christmas we celebrate God giving us Light through the birth of His Son. Jesus' words, actions, suffering, death and resurrection tell us that life does have meaning, suffering eventually ends, life is not over at death, and God is loving and forgiving.

That's the "great light" for all of us who walk in darkness need to see.
