




- Starting February 1, 2023 free parking will be available in the parking garage east of Broadway at 12th Street. You will need a barcode to exit. The barcode will be distributed in person when you visit the Cathedral and will also be available on the Cathedral Website. The barcode will change every month.
- 2.. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions:scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print it out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet.
- 3. The bar codes can be used as many times as needed during the month, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month and you won't have to get replacements. When you get the code for the next month, dispose of the old one. However, replacements are available online and at the Cathedral.
 - 4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, you need only tell the attendant that you are there for a church service and you will be let in free.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway where you will also be allowed to park for free.

THE LIGHT OF CHARITY


FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
ISAIAH 58:7-10

If you do good things for others, good things will be done for you. That simple promise comes from Isaiah's prophecy. Feed the hungry. Shelter the homeless. Clothe the naked. Then your wound will be healed.

Isaiah addresses people being freed from their oppression. He tells them to be mindful of the needy. Several weeks ago, we heard him promise that those who had dwelled in dark ness would see a great light. Now he says that light is coming from a specific location. It will come from within. As God's chosen people, their light will shine. But they should not just sit and wait for it. Their light will shine when they act in kindness.

Food, shelter, and clothing are basic human needs. Without them, people cannot live. Isaiah expects that those who have will share with those who have not. If we do not, the world can not live at peace.



At Seedtime: Celebrating a Diocesan Day of Prayer Saturday February 4, 2023

Seeds represent a microcosm of all life. By our prayer, we acknowledge God's love for all creation and our responsibility to care for it. As planting season begins in late winter or early spring we the Church seek God's blessing on seeds, crops, and all creation. Gardeners, farmers, and all growers especially ask God's protection for seeds (or young plants) in fields, gardens, and greenhouses.

In the past, the Church marked certain times of the year with Ember Days and Rogation Days, including prayers for the <u>Blessing of Seeds at Planting Time</u>, as well as prayers for the <u>Blessing of Fields and Flocks</u> (Book of Blessings).

Our diocesan day of prayer occurs on Saturday, Feb. 4, 2023. Parishes can celebrate God's gift of seeds as a microcosm of all life in several ways:

- Parish masses on Feb. 4 use the Roman Missal's prayers "At Seedtime" (#27 from Masses for Various Needs and Occasions). Blessing of seeds can occur in this context.
- Parish formation efforts can use this insert from the Office of Divine Worship (https://kcsjcatholic.org/office/divine-worship) with children or youth for sacramental preparation, or for Care of Creation ministries.
- Households, religious communities, or other spiritual groups can use the insert on a suitable day later in the planting season.
- Bishop Johnston will bless seeds at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on Saturday, Feb. 4 at 10:00 a.m. mass. Seeds can be brought in person, or sent with someone ahead of time. Especially invited are gardeners, farmers, greenhouse growers, and all who work with plants or seeds.



Blessing of Seeds 2023

Introduction

Leader: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Let us praise God, who plants the seeds and reaps the harvest. Blessed be God forever. **R.** Blessed be God forever.

Leader: Today we seek God's blessing of these seeds and the crops they will produce. Christ reminds us that, unless the seed is planted in the earth and dies, it will not yield fruit. As these seeds grow and are cared for, may they be signs of the new life from God. *{Book of Blessings 992}*

Grant, we pray, that this land, enriched by your bounty and cultivated by human hands, may be fertile with abundant crops. 
