




# \* Cathedral Parking Barcode

- 1. Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway at 12th Street. You need a barcode to exit. The barcode will be distributed in person when you visit the Cathedral and will also be available on the Cathedral Website. The barcode will change every month.
- 2.. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print it out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet.



- 3. The bar codes can be used as many times as needed during the month, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month and you won't have to get replacements. When you get the code for the next month, dispose of the old one. However, replacements are available online and at the Cathedral.
  - On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, you need only tell the attendant that you are there for a church service and you will be let in free.
  - 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway where you will also be allowed to park for free.

# **Water in the Desert**

Third Sunday of Lent Exodus 17:3–7

In the desert of our lives there are plenty of complaints. Bills are too high. Friends are too few. Health is too frail. Faith is too weak. In the desert of our lives there is plenty of blame. Our leaders are unconcerned. Children are too demanding. Society is sinful. Life is not fair. In the desert, the people of Israel grumble against Moses. They have too little water, and they are blaming Moses. Moses blames God, and asks for some divine intervention.

God promises Moses, "I will stand in front of you on the rock." Moses strikes that rock, and water gushes forth.

Life brings its share of struggle. We sometimes rebel against the very place where God has invited us to be. We forget that God has given us life, has entered into covenant with us, and stands ever before us. So we complain. We may not realize that we are standing right at the water for which we thirst.

The discomforts of your life will not be hard to name. Have you brought some of them on yourself? Has God placed some of them in your path? Do you trust that God stands with you, water at the ready? From where will that water come?



# THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

## WHAT?

The way we embrace Christ's call to conversion.

The step we take to express true **repentance** for our offenses.

The **confession** of our sins.

The reception of God's pardon and peace.

The **restoration** of our relationship with God and with the Church.

After Jesus declared that
Peter would be the rock
upon which he would build
his Church, he said to Peter,
"I will give you the keys to the
kingdom of heaven.
Whatever you bind on earth
shall be bound in heaven;
and whatever you loose on earth
shall be loosed in heaven."
(Mt 16:13-20)



After his resurrection,
Jesus appeared to his disciples,
extended his peace,
breathed the holy Spirit on them,
and sent them out saying,
"Whose sins you forgive
are forgiven them,
and whose sins you retain
are retained."
(In 20:19-23)

## WHY?

We were born with the effects of **original sin**: disobedience toward God and a lack of trust in his goodness (Gen 3:1-11).

God the Father sent his Son, **Jesus Christ**, to save us from our sins (Jn 3:16).

Jesus accomplished his saving mission by establishing the **Kingdom of God** and by suffering, dying on the cross, rising from the dead, and ascending into heaven (Mt 5:17).

Jesus established the **Church** to continue his saving mission by the power of the Holy Spirit through the celebration of the sacraments (Mk 1:15, Jn 19:34, Acts 2: 1-4, 2 Cor 5:18).

Through faith in the Gospel and Baptism, we are first washed clean of all sin (Acts 2:38).

Through the **Sacrament of Penance**, we continue to experience the forgiveness of our sins (Mt 16:13-20, Jn 20:19-23).

# THE ORDER OF PENANCE

The Church celebrates the Sacrament of Penance using the *Order of Penance*.

The revised rites and formulas of the *Order of Penance* of the Second Vatican Council were promulgated in 1973.

A new translation was provided in 2023.


# Celebrating the Sacrament of Penance or "going to confession" is a liturgical action that consists of:

- 1. The Reception of the Penitent
- 2. The Reading of the Word of God (Optional)
- 3. The Confession of Sins and The Acceptance of Satisfaction
- 4. The Prayer of the Penitent and The Absolution
- 5. The Proclamation of Praise of God and The Dismissal of the Penitent

# THE ACTS OF THE PENITENT

- 1. Contrition (sorrow for sin)
- 2. Confession (inward examination, outward accusation)
- 3. Satisfaction (an act of penance)

"Penance requires . . . the sinner to endure all things willingly, be contrite of heart, confess with the lips, and practice complete humility and fruitful satisfaction."





# Going to Confession in Twelve Easy Steps

- 1. Examine your conscience, call to mind your sins, and then enter the confessional.
- 2. The priest will welcome and receive you.
- 3. Make the sign of the cross and say: "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."
- 4. The priest will invite you to trust in God. He may also read a text of Sacred Scripture.
- 5. Say these or similar words:
- "Bless me Father for I have sinned. It has been \_\_\_\_long since my last confession. These are my sins..."
- 6. Tell the priest your sins. Then say these or similar words: "For these and all of my sins, I am sorry."
- 7. Accept your work of penance (prayers, act of kindness, etc.) to help make satisfaction and amend your life.
- 8. Express your sorrow for your sins (Act of Contrition) in these or similar words:

"O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart for all the wrong I have done and for the good I have failed to do,

because by sinning I have offended you,

who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more,

and to avoid the occasions of sin.

Through the merits of the Passion of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy."

- 9. Receive God's forgiveness as the priest prays the Prayer of Absolution.
- 10. At the end of the Prayer of Absolution, reply: "Amen."
- 11. Give praise to God. When the priest says: "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good," conclude: "For his mercy endures forever."
- 12. Go in peace and remember to say or do your penance.
