- 1. Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway at 12th Street. You need a barcode to exit. The barcode will be distributed in person when you visit the Cathedral and will also be available on the Cathedral Website. The barcode will change every month.
- 2.. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print it out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet.



- 3. The bar codes can be used as many times as needed during the month, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month and you won't have to get replacements. When you get the code for the next month, dispose of the old one. However, replacements are available online and at the Cathedral.
 - On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, you need only tell the attendant that you are there for a church service and you will be let in free.
 - 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway where you will also be allowed to park for free.

A CHANGE OF HEART

Fifth Sunday of Lent Ezekiel 37:12–14

Are you still being faithful to your Lenten res olutions? No matter how firm or weak your resolve, you have come to face the mystery of sin, loss, and death. Changing old habits is hard. To change something is to lose something.

Those chosen for Baptism this Easter will change their old habits. They will put to death whatever has kept them from life in Christ.

The faithful also will change old habits. They will put to death the sin that mars their faith□fulness to God. All in the community need the prayerful and penitential support of their broth□ers and sisters in Christ.

Ezekiel addresses people who have lived in exile and oppression, far from the center of their social and religious life. They have lived in a tomb. Now God promises, "I will open your graves and have you rise from them." God will dwell with them and give them the divine spirit.

This Lent, the church has invited you to examine your life, to confront your sin, and to secure your intent to change. The season is nearly over. The day of promise draws near. God stands ready to open your grave and bring you forth to new life. If you die to whatever keeps you from God, you will grow from the lessons of loss.


