- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway at 12th Street. You
 need a barcode to exit. The barcode will be distributed in person when you visit the
 Cathedral and will also be available on the Cathedral Website. The barcode will
 change every month.
- 2.. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print it out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet.
- 3. The bar codes can be used as many times as needed during the month, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month and you won't have to get replacements. When you get the code for the next month, dispose of the old one. However, replacements are available online and at the Cathedral.
 - 4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, you need only tell the attendant that you are there for a church service and you will be let in free.
 - 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway where you will also be allowed to park for free.







Good News, Bad News

Fourth Sunday of Easter Acts 2:14a, 36–41

"What do we do now?" That question arises whenever bad news comes our way. We follow our routine life but then hit a bump in the road. Something we were not expecting has appeared on the path. The road on which we felt so secure does not feel the same any more. "What do we do now?"

That is how people reacted on the first Pentecost after they had heard the end of Peter's sermon. Peter had just explained to them the core message about Jesus' life, death, and Resurrection. The people swallowed hard because this good news felt like bad news.

Peacefully, they had been following their routines, paying little attention to the message of this prophet Jesus who had lived among them. But then witnesses said he had risen from the dead. They realized the fullness of his mes\susage. "What do we do now?" they wondered.

Peter's solution is direct: "Repent and be baptized."

Sometimes the good news of Easter feels like bad news. We regret we did not do enough for Lent. We confess the limitations of our commitment to Jesus. We realize we need the help that comes from his word alone. What do we do now?

From a bush school, these young people have made it to university. In my parish we have a program helping needy children get educated and become responsible people. Some of them take education lightly, others work hard and become successful. Among these are two young adults who have completed their Bachelor's Degree in Chemical Engineering.

They would like to embark on a Masters degree in Pharmaceutical Engineering but unfortunately, there is no university in Uganda which offers this course at Master's Degree level. These college students have secured places in universities in Germany and Austria but we do not have the funds to send them there. The course takes two years. The total cost per year is about \$12,000 per student. For the two students we need \$24,000 per year.

Please help these young people to achieve their goal so that they can go back to their country to help their people. Thank you for your generosity.
