1. Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway at 12th Street. You need a barcode to exit. The barcode will be distributed in person when you visit the Cathedral and will also be available on the Cathedral Website. The barcode will change every month.

2.. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print it out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet.

3. The bar codes can be used as many times as needed during the month, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month and you won't have to get replacements. When you get the code for the next month, dispose of the old one. However, replacements are available online and at the Cathedral.

4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, you need only tell the attendant that you are there for a church service and you will be let in free.

5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway where you will also be allowed to park for free.

Beyond Imagining

Fifth Sunday of Easter
Acts 6:1-7



It started with an argument about dinner. Three weeks ago we heard the happy story of the blissful teamwork among the early Christians. They loved one another, shared things in common, and their numbers grew. Well, the honeymoon is over. As the numbers increased, so did disagreements. It all started with an argument about dinner.

Greek widows were not getting enough to eat before the food ran out. The Twelve were too busy preaching to manage meals. But they had to have charity at home if they were to preach authentically, so they appointed seven leaders to straighten out the problems with dinner. That is how we first got deacons in the church.

Deacons may have started as table ministers, but they did not end that way. Not long after this story we find them preaching the Gospel near and far with all the fervor of the Twelve. The Word of God spread because of the work of deacons, but it never would have happened if there had not first been an argument about dinner.

Arguments do not have to lead to anger and broken relationships. They can lead to solutions with better results than anyone ever imagined.

From a bush school, these young people have made it to university. In my parish we have a program helping needy children get educated and become responsible people. Some of them take education lightly, others work hard and become successful. Among these are two young adults who have completed their Bachelor's Degree in Chemical Engineering.

They would like to embark on a Masters degree in Pharmaceutical Engineering but unfortunately, there is no university in Uganda which offers this course at Master's Degree level. These college students have secured places in universities in Germany and Austria but we do not have the funds to send them there. The course takes two years. The total cost per year is about \$12,000 per student. For the two students we need \$24,000 per year.

Please help these young people to achieve their goal so that they can go back to their country to help their people. Thank you for your generosity.

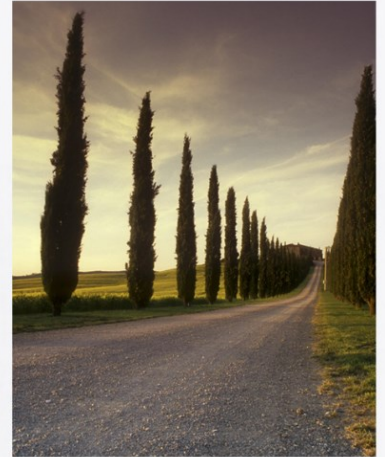

IKC Welcome Alliance (KCWA) is an all-volunteer interfaith organization committed to assisting legal foreign asylum seekers who enter the US through the legal port of entry at El Paso, TX. KCWA has not accepted a bus of asylum seekers arriving by bus in Kansas City since December 2022. The drop in border crossings is mainly because of a Center for Disease Control (CDC) implemented policy called "Title 42" which, in effect, closed the border because of Covid fears. Title 42 expires on May 11. It is generally believed that once Title 42 expires, the southern border will be inundated again with asylum seekers. If this happens, KCWA may be asked to accept future buses. If you want to learn more about the work of KCWA, go to their webpage: KCWelcomeAlliance.org. By completing the "Volunteer Form", you will begin to receive updates and be invited to volunteer once we know the dates of future buses. You may also make a tax-exempt donation from the webpage.
