
Assistive Listening Devices

CHURCH BARCODE BLOCK 89 JUNE 61630 EXPIRES 6/30/2023.



- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway at 12th Street. You need a barcode to exit. The barcode will be distributed in person when you visit the Cathedral and will also be available on the Cathedral Website. The barcode will change every month.
- 2.. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print it out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet.
- 3. The bar codes can be used as many times as needed during the month, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month and you won't have to get replacements. When you get the code for the next month, dispose of the old one. However, replacements are available online and at the Cathedral.
- 4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, you need only tell the attendant that you are there for a church service and you will be let in free.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway where you will also be allowed to park for free.

THE GIFT OF UNDERSTANDING

Pentecost Vigil Genesis 11:1–9

Visitors to foreign countries are frightened if they do not know the language. It is hard to imagine how much we rely on language. We can talk with strangers, read signs, and raise children with comparative ease because we have established something in common—language.

Take it away, and chaos reigns. People misunderstand one another, they grow impatient, or they presume others are ignorant or malicious. All this can happen when we do not speak the same language.

The Book of Genesis explains the existence of multiple languages as a punishment from God. When people tried to build too large a city for themselves, God punished them by confusing their speech. Human cooperation became chaos.

God is the creator of everything, and the ruler of all. God even rules over language. When the Holy Spirit came on the first Pentecost and bestowed the gift of tongues upon the apostles, the confusion of languages ceased. Everyone could understand. The Christian message was central enough to human experience to resonate with all people, no matter what language they spoke.

Whenever we cannot understand what life is saying to us, we have only to turn to the ruler of languages. The Holy Spirit will translate.

From a bush school, these young people have made it to university. In my parish we have a program helping needy children get educated and become responsible people. Some of them take education lightly, others work hard and become successful. Among these are two young adults who have completed their Bachelor's Degree in Chemical Engineering.

They would like to embark on a Masters degree in Pharmaceutical Engineering but unfortunately, there is no university in Uganda which offers this course at Master's Degree level. These college students have secured places in universities in Germany and Austria but we do not have the funds to send them there. The course takes two years. The total cost per year is about \$12,000 per student. For the two students we need \$24,000 per year.

Please help these young people to achieve their goal so that they can go back to their country to help their people. Thank you for your generosity.
