
It was a very difficult decision to leave the Cathedral family.




Raised over \$1700 to help parish family at Christmas after they lost everything in an Apartment Fire

A Better View

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Exodus 19:2–6a

The journey of human life crosses many deserts. For years we await the realization of our dreams. We make sacrifices we hope will find reward. We sense the direction we are heading, but we do not know the obstacles along the way.

Looking back at the road we have traveled, we are amazed to have come so far. Looking ahead fills us with apprehension or adventure. In the desert of life, we need reassurance. We need signs that we are on the right path, that our future still lies ahead, and that God has not abandoned us.

Crossing the desert, the Israelites approached such a place. They left one desert behind and entered the desert of Sinai. There Moses climbed the mountain, where he got a better view. God spoke to him, pointing out how far Moses had come, not just in miles, but also in intimacy. God had rescued the people from danger. If they remained faithful to the covenant, they would be God's special possession.

Every so often, we need that view. We need to look back for the strength to forge ahead. We discover in our past the care of God, and we build our trust in the future. Through this Sunday's rest, we recommit ourselves to our covenant.
