

CATHEDRAL LUNCH & LEARN SERIES GOD'S RECIPE FOR A WONDERFUL LIFE

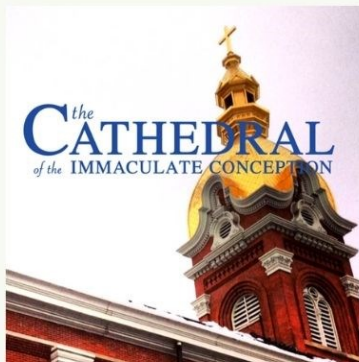

The Pastoral Associate at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception will assist the pastor with administrative and pastoral duties, serve as a member of the parish staff, provide leadership and consultation for various groups, committees and processes in the parish. This position will collaborate in or direct a variety of aspects of parish life such as the faith formation team, RCIA, sacramental preparation, adult faith development, evangelization, the stewardship council with volunteerism and the annual auction, senior adults, women's spirituality, young adult ministry, sacramental records, substitute priests and social media. The position is full-time based upon 40 hours per week.

- Plan and prepare events or series for adult faith formation.
- Collaborate with Young Adult group for regularly-scheduled functions.
- Develop school-year based faith formation for children and youth.
- Direct a variety of aspects of parish life and sacramental preparation, which includes RCIA, adult confirmation, First Communion, Baptism, and Marriage preparation.

This person will be responsible for the effective, efficient, and safe maintenance, renovation and upkeep of the parish buildings and grounds. This position is full time and will average 40 hours per week.

Duties:

- Maintain, renovate, restore and see to the upkeep of buildings' mechanical, plumbing and electrical systems.
- Perform semi-skilled carpentry, plumbing, electrical and other minor repair work.
- Maintain grounds by mowing, pruning and ice and snow removal with ground equipment.
- Maintain inventory of supplies.
- Engage and supervise outside contractors.

An Everlasting Friendship

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Jeremiah 20:10–13

A broken friendship causes unimaginable pain. Close companionship brings joy to life. With a special few friends we share our inmost thoughts. Deep conversations strengthen the bond of love. But when friendship ends, when trust is broken, when shared experiences lie shattered, the pain is immense.

Jeremiah the prophet endured this awful experience. He knew the fear and loneliness of betrayal. His friends did more than break their relationship. They became Jeremiah's aggressive enemies. They looked for opportunities to denounce him. They sought vengeance against him. They whispered in collusion together.

The prophet overheard the plots, and terror seized his life.

Jeremiah somehow kept his trust in God. He believed that God would overcome these enemies. In desperation, he hoped that the misfortune they wished on him would befall them instead. Jeremiah believed in God's record. In the past, God rescued the poor from the wicked. He assumed that God would now do the same for him.

Human beings fail. Our best efforts may fall short. Our ability to make and sustain friendships may falter. But God's love will never cease. It will provide a sure foundation when the protective walls of friendship crack.
