## Description

### Position Objective

The Pastoral Associate at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception will assist the pastor with administrative and pastoral duties, serve as a member of the parish staff, provide leadership and consultation for various groups, committees and processes in the parish. This position will collaborate in or direct a variety of aspects of parish life such as the faith formation team, RCIA, sacramental preparation, adult faith development, evangelization, the stewardship council with volunteerism and the annual auction, senior adults, women's spirituality, young adult ministry, sacramental records, substitute priests and social media. The position is full-time based upon 40 hours per week.

### Essential Duties

- Plan and prepare events or series for adult faith formation.
- Collaborate with Young Adult group for regularly-scheduled functions.
- Develop school-year based faith formation for children and youth.
- Direct a variety of aspects of parish life and sacramental preparation, which includes RCIA, adult confirmation, First Communion, Baptism, and Marriage preparation.

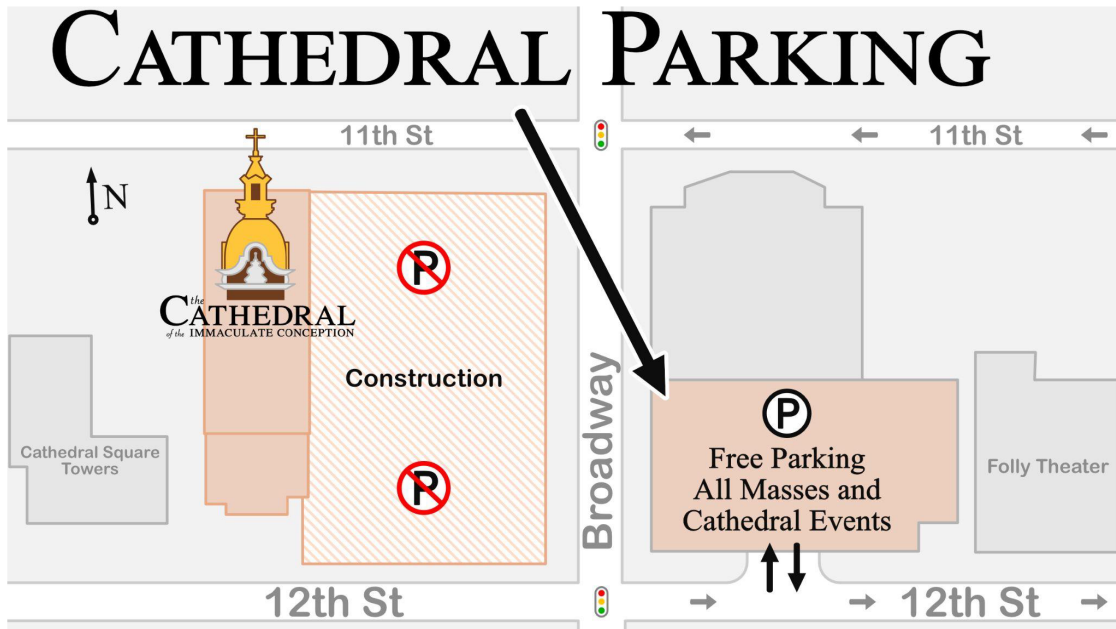

  - 5 years' experience in Pastoral Ministry.
  - Basic proficiency in Microsoft Office.
  - Practicing Catholic with ethical standards, personal integrity, and conduct consistent with the morals and teachings of the Catholic Church; includes faithful obedience to the Magisterium.
  - Proficiency in the use and management of digital and social media.
- Preferred
  - Fluency in more than one language, as well as English (both verbal and cultural competency).

### [Parking Barcode for August](#)

1. **Free parking** is available in the **parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street**. *You will need a barcode to exit.* The **barcode** will be distributed when you visit the Cathedral and is also available on the [Cathedral Website](#). The barcode *will change every month*.
2. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print the barcode out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet. It would be best to print the barcode on heavy stock paper.
3. The barcode can be used **as many times as needed during the month**, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month. When you get the new code for the next month, dispose of the old one. Replacements are available [online](#) and at the Cathedral.
4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, tell the attendant that you are there for a church event and you will be let in free.
5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the Ten Central Garage at 10<sup>th</sup> & Broadway where you will also be allowed to park for free.
6. If **riding a bike**, racks will be available soon. For now, please park in the vestibule.

## A Place of Welcome

**Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
**Isaiah 56:1, 6–7**

People different from us can really make us uncomfortable. It is like we do not share the same language or rely on the same experiences. We have different circles of friends and different sources of trust. For many of us, the best way to deal with people different from us is to avoid them.

Tolerance is good, but sometimes even tolerance masks prejudice. We tolerate those who are different as long as they act like we do. If they observe our customs, do not hang out in packs of their own kind, and visit our places with respect, we may accept them.

More challenging is to let those who are different from us change our own way of thinking –to let them open our minds to other possibilities and allow us to grow. God spoke a message of openness through the mouth of the prophet Isaiah. The God known as the originator of the covenant with the Israelites, the God who made them a special possession, offers a different view in this prophecy. God will bring foreigners to the holy mountain and make them joyful in its place of prayer. “My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples.”
