





Position Objective

The Pastoral Associate at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception will assist the pastor with administrative and pastoral duties, serve as a member of the parish staff, provide leadership and consultation for various groups, committees and processes in the parish. This position will collaborate in or direct a variety of aspects of parish life such as the faith formation team, RCIA, sacramental preparation, adult faith development, evangelization, the stewardship council with volunteerism and the annual auction, senior adults, women's spirituality, young adult ministry, sacramental records, substitute priests and social media. The position is full-time based upon 40 hours per week.

- · Plan and prepare events or series for adult faith formation.
- · Collaborate with Young Adult group for regularly-scheduled functions.
- · Develop school-year based faith formation for children and youth.
- · Direct a variety of aspects of parish life and sacramental preparation, which includes RCIA, adult confirmation, First Communion, Baptism, and Marriage preparation.



Parking Barcode for September





- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street.
 <u>You will need a barcode to exit</u>. The <u>barcode</u> will be distributed when you visit the
 Cathedral and is also available on the <u>Cathedral Website</u>. The barcode will change
 every month.
- 2. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print the barcode out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet. It would be best to print the barcode on heavy stock paper.
- 3. The barcode can be used **as many times as needed during the month**, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month. When you get the new code for the next month, dispose of the old one. Replacements are available **online** and at the Cathedral.
- 4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, tell the attendant that you are there for a church event and you will be let in free.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the <u>Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway</u> where you will also be allowed to <u>park for free</u>.
- 6. If riding a bike, racks will be available soon. For now, please park in the vestibule.

SPEAK UP

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Jeremiah 20:7–9

When you know you are right, you can keep speaking the truth, even in the face of opposilition. If you have not thought enough about the right thing to do, you are in danger of being influenced to do something else. If your need for acceptance is stronger than your need for doing right, you will surrender to beliefs opposed to your own. But when you know you are right, and when it becomes a matter of expressing who you are and what you believe, you cannot give in. You have to speak up. You have to keep on going, even when others do not support you anymore.

Jeremiah the prophet, in his prayer, has heard God's Word, but when he speaks it, people deride him. He tries being quiet, not telling the message God has given him, a message that expresses outrage against the misdeeds of his companions. But when he tries to remain silent, the Word of God becomes like a fire burning in his heart. He cannot keep it in. It must come out.

It is not easy to speak God's Word. To hold it in becomes unbearable. To speak it creates enemies. But only the truth brings inner peace.


