LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

SACRISTANS

A Sacristan is a trained Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion who oversees the materials and ministers needed for the celebration of the liturgy. A sacristan prepares the altar and sanctuary with the necessary liturgical objects needed to celebrate Mass and other liturgies.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion help distribute the Body and Blood of Christ at Mass. They may also bring communion to the homebound and hospitalized. Volunteers for this ministry attend a diocesan training session and are commissioned for service at a Mass.

ALTAR SERVERS

Altar Servers assist the Priests during Mass and other liturgies. This is a vital ministry. Servers must be in the 4th grade or older and undergo a training session. Families may serve together in this ministry.

READERS

Readers proclaim the Word of God at all Masses and other liturgies. Readers are scheduled at the Mass they usually attend. Optional diocesan training is provided throughout the year.

USHERS & GREETERS

Ushers and Greeters convey a welcoming and hospitable spirit at the Cathedral. They warmly welcome parishioners and visitors as they arrive and offer to assist those with special needs. Ushers help seat people for Mass and collect the offering.

DECORATORS

Art and environment enhance the Cathedral with color, light, living environment, and other elements. Decorators enrich and enliven the worship experience. In addition to creating and maintaining a constant environment for all masses throughout the year, our larger undertakings include Advent, Christmas and Easter Masses, and special feasts.

AV MINISTRY

Members of this outreach and evangelizing ministry assist with the live streaming of our liturgies and special events.

MUSIC MINISTERS

For generations, the Church has used songs to cry out in praise and lament before God. Music and liturgy are inseparable. The primary role of music ministers is to inspire the sung prayer of the assembly. Cantors should possess strong voices and have good sightreading abilities. The diocesan choir prepares music for special celebrations with the Bishop.



Parking Barcode for September



91930 EXPIRES 9/30/2023.

- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street.
 <u>You will need a barcode to exit</u>. The <u>barcode</u> will be distributed when you visit the
 Cathedral and is also available on the <u>Cathedral Website</u>. The barcode will change
 every month.
- 2. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print the barcode out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet. It would be best to print the barcode on heavy stock paper.
- 3. The barcode can be used **as many times as needed during the month**, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month. When you get the new code for the next month, dispose of the old one. Replacements are available **online** and at the Cathedral.
- 4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, tell the attendant that you are there for a church event and you will be let in free.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the <u>Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway</u> where you will also be allowed to <u>park for free</u>.
- 6. If riding a bike, racks will be available soon. For now, please park in the vestibule.

Assistive Listening Devices

Please visit the sacristy before Mass to borrow a device from the sacristan. You are encouraged to bring your own headphones to plug into the unit. Kindly return it to the sacristy following Mass.



Letting Go of Anger

Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Sirach 27:30—28:7

The oddest thing about being angry is that it feels good. Anger takes our opinions, our feelings, and our actions and unites them in one interrelationship. When we get good and angry at somebody, it feels so good that it is hard to change. Anger locks us up. It makes us afraid to let go. The longer we hold the anger the harder it is ever to change.

How else can we explain the comment by Sirach: "Wrath and anger are hateful things, yet the sinner hugs them tight"?

When you forgive someone, you are the one who becomes free. When you withhold forgive\(\mathbb{I}\) ness, you hurt yourself, not just the other. Often the person against whom we hold the anger pays little attention to our feelings. But the feel\(\mathbb{I}\) ings remain strong within us, eating away at our ability to find peace.

Granting forgiveness does not have to mean approving of what an offender did. It does not mean you have to be best friends. It just means letting go of the hate. If you quit letting the offender control your feelings, you can regain some peace and enjoy the mercy of God.

Who have you not forgiven? Why? By remaining angry, are you helping anyone?
