The Banquet of Life

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 25:6–10a




Death creeps into our lives almost secretly. We lose members of our families and close friends. We buckle up in the car as an unreflective admission that each trip poses mortal danger. We age and experience the gradual loss of our abilities.

For those who believe in Christ, death is but a passageway to eternity. The funeral rites of the church help us ritualize our belief even as we mourn our loss.

Isaiah offers images of God's providence that fit the hope of Christians. He imagines a new Jerusalem, settled on God's holy mountain. In his vision, God provides a rich banquet—not just minimal food for the hungry, not just basic sustenance, but a banquet in which God's people taste delight. Isaiah imagines death as a veil that covers everyone, a web woven over all the nations. But in this vision, that veil is fragile, subject to destruction by God's deliberate might.

For Christians, the contrast between death and life is the contrast between hunger and banquet. Whenever the sadness of death threatens to overpower the people we love or our very lives, our belief in Christ brings all the comfort of rich food and drink.

Parking Barcode for October

- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street.
 <u>You will need a barcode to exit</u>. The <u>barcode</u> will be distributed when you visit the
 Cathedral and is also available on the <u>Cathedral Website</u>. The barcode will change
 every month.
- 2. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print the barcode out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet. It would be best to print the barcode on heavy stock paper.
- 3. The barcode can be used as many times as needed during the month, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month. When you get the new code for the next month, dispose of the old one. Replacements are available <u>online</u> and at the Cathedral.
- 4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, tell the attendant that you are there for a church event and you will be let in free.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the <u>Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway</u> where you will also be allowed to <u>park for free</u>.
- 6. If **riding a bike**, racks will be available soon. For now, please park in the vestibule.
