
Artisanal Sounds for the Modern Ear

- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street. <u>You will need a barcode to exit</u>. The <u>barcode</u> will be distributed when you visit the Cathedral and is also available on the <u>Cathedral Website</u>. The barcode will change every month.
- 2. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print the barcode out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet. It would be best to print the barcode on heavy stock paper.
- 3. The barcode can be used as many times as needed during the month, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month. When you get the new code for the next month, dispose of the old one. Replacements are available <u>online</u> and at the Cathedral.
- 4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, tell the attendant that you are there for a church event and you will be let in free.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the <u>Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway</u> where you will also be allowed to <u>park for free</u>.
- 6. If riding a bike, racks will be available soon. For now, please park in the vestibule.



The Commandments of Justice

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Exodus 22:20–26

How does your church community help the poor? Do you have collections for the needy? Do you distribute food through a pantry? Do you help people find jobs? Do you offer training?

Does your church perform acts of justice that try to change the condition of the poor? Do you advocate for improved legislation? Do you call attention to the ways that the wealth of a few impairs the resources of the many? Do you edu⊠cate people about the means of reducing poverty?

The Book of Exodus includes many of the laws that God asked the Israelites to observe. The most famous are the Ten Commandments. But in addition to them, hundreds of other com®mandments found their way into the legislative books of God's people. Some of them pertained to the poor: Do not frustrate travelers. Protect the widow and orphan. Do not take advantage of people needing loans. All these rules helped Israel live out the big picture of the Ten Commandments in the everyday situations that constitute the moral life.

The reduction of poverty will take many efforts. It will mean living every day being mindful of the needs of the poor, but it will also create structures that seek justice for the oppressed.

2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and

3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500 or crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

The Diocese has a sincere commitment to providing care and healing resources to victims of sexual abuse and their families.
