Parking Barcode for December



1211231 EXPIRES 12/31/2023.

- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street.
 <u>You will need a barcode to exit</u>. The <u>barcode</u> will be distributed when you visit the
 Cathedral and is also available on the <u>Cathedral Website</u>. The barcode will change
 every month.
- 2. Attendees can pull out a parking ticket any time to get into the garage when the gates are down. Then you need to use the barcode to get out. The machine will display instructions: scan the barcode first, then insert the original ticket. If you display the code on your phone, it should let you out. If you try to print the barcode out in advance, please make sure you are using a high resolution printer, like a laser jet. It would be best to print the barcode on heavy stock paper.
- 3. The barcode can be used as many times as needed during the month, so pick up a code at the first service you attend. Then hang on to that code for the rest of the month. When you get the new code for the next month, dispose of the old one. Replacements are available <u>online</u> and at the Cathedral.
- 4. On high activity Bartle Hall Event days when MidCon staffs the garage entries, tell the attendant that you are there for a church event and you will be let in free.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you will be directed to the <u>Ten Central Garage at 10th & Broadway</u> where you will also be allowed to <u>park for free</u>.
- 6. If **riding a bike**, racks will be available soon. For now, please park in the vestibule.





Paving a Direct Route

Second Sunday of Advent Isaiah 40:1–5, 9–11

Whenever a highway changes from two lanes to four, you can often see the improvements. The old highway follows the dips and curves of the landscape. The new highway better controls the landscape. It is straighter and more level. The engineers have figured out how to improve the road, and citizens have supported the additional expense.

People like straight highways. They are quicker, safer, and more pleasant. In the prophecy of Isaiah, a voice cries out, "In the desert prepare the way of the Lord!" John the Baptist quoted this passage to prepare people for the coming of Jesus.

Make a straight highway in the wasteland. Fill in the valleys and lower the mountains. Make a smooth, direct road in your spiritual life.

During Advent we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ in our lives. In the past we formed habits as sturdy as two-lane roads. They get us where we want to go, but sometimes not by the most direct route.

We have only a few weeks until Christmas. It is time to move the roadblocks and detours that keep us from encountering Christ. Hardness of heart, stinginess of time, or unbending habits —which of these needs repair on your highway toward Christ?

Year End Giving Options

As 2023 draws to a close, some folks inquire about end of year giving options to the parish. Here are some options may provide personal benefits, in addition to supporting the parish.

RMD – Required Minimum Distribution (for retirees only) The IRS does not allow folks to keep funds in retirement accounts indefinitely, without taxing the gains in those accounts. Withdrawn funds are considered ordinary income by the IRS and are taxed at your current income tax rate.

Qualified Charitable Donation

QCD – The Qualified Charitable Donation allows individuals, over 70 ½ years, to withdraw and donate to a charity (from their IRA), and those withdrawals are not counted as ordinary income and are not taxed. A QCD may satisfy an individual's RMD, thereby avoiding taxes on the IRA withdrawal.

Example: John's Required Minimum Distribution this year is \$15,000 from his IRA per IRS guidelines.

- a) John receives the \$15,000 required distribution from his IRA. The \$15,000 is considered as Ordinary Income by the IRS and is taxed according to John's income tax bracket. If John is in a 20% tax bracket, he would owe \$3,000 in ordinary income tax because of this \$15,000 required withdrawal.
- b) John utilizes the QCD and donates the \$15,000 to the parish from his IRA account. The Qualified Charitable Donation of \$15,000 is not ordinary income, resulting in no tax on this IRA withdrawal. By utilizing the QCD, retirees (over 70 ½) can make charitable donations from an IRA account, and not have to pay income tax on the amount withdrawn/donated.

Under QCD guidelines, individuals may donate more than the amount required by the RMD (with limitations), as a non-taxable event, so long as the QCD comes from an IRA account. Again, the QCD is only available to those who have reached 70½ years.

Stock Donations

Donating stock is great way to support the parish and avoid the capital gains tax.

Example: Mike & Kathy bought 100 shares of IBM stock, seven years ago, for \$100 per share (an investment of \$10,000). Their IBM stock is now worth \$200 per share, so the value of their investment has grown to \$20,000. They had been thinking of donating \$20,000 to the parish building fund.

- A) They sell the IBM stock, with the intention of sending the proceeds to the parish.

 Result: The sale of the stock produces a \$10,000 capital gain, as they had bought the stock for \$10,000 and sold it for \$20,000. This \$10,000 profit is subject to capital gains tax.

 If the capital gains tax is 20% they will owe the IRS \$2,000 (\$10,000 x 20% = \$2,000) The net result of their stock sale is \$18,000 reducing the amount they might donate to the parish.
- B) Mike & Kathy donate the IBM stock directly to the parish.
 Result: The parish receives and sells the stock for \$20,000.
 Mike & Kathy have no capital gains and therefore no capital gains tax to pay.
