Parking Barcode for January

- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street. You will need a <u>barcode</u>. The barcode is available on slips of paper at the Cathedral and on our <u>website</u>. The barcode changes every month.
- 2. To enter the garage, using paper or your phone, turn the barcode toward the electronic reader to raise the arm. You will also use it to exit.
- 3. The same barcode can be used throughout the month.
- 4. If an attendant is on duty, show your barcode and explain you are going to the Cathedral.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you may be directed to a different garage.
- 6. If riding a bike, you may park it in the vestibule.

God's Change of Heart

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Jonah 3:1–5, 10



Does anything ever change God's mind? Today's story from Jonah answers yes. Most of us know Jonah as the prophet who was swallowed by a fish. Not everyone remembers the rest of the story.

Jonah didn't want to be a prophet. When God asked him to bring a message to Nineveh, Jonah refused. He ran away, boarded a ship, and tried to hide from God.

It didn't work. The ship hit turbulent waters. The sailors believed that God was coming after someone on the boat. They figured out it was Jonah, so they threw him overboard and into the jaws of a giant fish. After three days, the fish delivered Jonah safely to land. Surely, Jonah was relieved to see the earth again. But it probably shocked him to find out where he was. The fish had brought him to Nineveh, the very city where God wanted him to go in the first place.

So Jonah gave up. He prophesied destruction to Nineveh, as God had asked him to do. God was determined to punish the people for their sins.

But then something happened. The people repented, and they changed God's mind. God decided not to punish them after all.

Sometimes what changes God's mind is changing ours.
