The Rainbow Covenant

First Sunday of Lent Genesis 9:8–15

People give things up for Lent, but they also do some extra things. They enter into the renewal that God desires for all creation. Renewal often demands both strategies: giving up and doing extra.

Take God, for example. At the end of the story of Noah, God gave something up. You remember the story. People had behaved so badly that God sent a flood to wipe out creation. But God took pity on Noah, his family, and pairs of animals. As the floods receded, God established a new covenant with Noah and set a rainbow in the sky as its sign.

What did God give up? God gave up global floods. "There shall not be another flood to devastate the earth." God gave up giving up on people.

The story of our relationship with God did not end there. We know at the beginning of Lent where that story will end at Easter. God did more than give something up. God did something extra. God sent us a redeemer. By ending destruction and offering redemption, God set a perfect example of renewal. Lent is like a desert. It is also like a flood. But most of all, it is like the balance of sun, water, and soil that yields a bountiful harvest.



Parking Barcode for February

- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street. You will need a <u>barcode</u>. The barcode is available on slips of paper at the Cathedral and on our <u>website</u>. The barcode changes every month.
- 2. To enter the garage, using paper or your phone, turn the barcode toward the electronic reader to raise the arm. You will also use it to exit.
- 3. The same barcode can be used throughout the month.
- 4. If an attendant is on duty, show your barcode and explain you are going to the Cathedral.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you may be directed to a different garage.
- 6. If riding a bike, you may park it in the vestibule.
