A LITTLE "CONTROVERSY" AN ATTACK ON THE CATHOLIC CHURCH CAME IN THE MAIL

In recent weeks, many residents in the Kansas City metropolitan area have received an unsolicited book from Remnant Publications; The Great Controversy: Will Two Former Rivals Unite?

I found one in my mailbox and decided to do a little research. I discovered that we are the latest city in a series of mailing blitzes. People living in the cities of Chicago, Denver, Charlotte, New York, San Francisco, Washington D.C., Burlington and the states of Wyoming and Hawaii (just to name a few) have all received variations of this book over the past several years. During the past twenty-five years, Remnant Publications has printed and distributed millions of books.

Who is Remnant Publications? According to Cause IQ, Remnant Publications was founded in 1988. It is a notfor-profit organization with over \$12million in assets. Their focus is mailing religious books within the United States. Dwight Hall is the CEO and founder of Remnant Publications based in Michigan. Remnant Publications has been using zip code mailings for decades to send millions of unsolicited books to homes. According to Hall, some of the zip codes are selected because they have high crime rates. Others are selected because they are viewed as non-religious areas. However, many of these cities are known for their large Catholic populations.

Once I knew a little bit about who sent the book, I wanted to figure what is The Great Controversy: Will Two Former Rivals Unite? This book was originally written in the 1850's by E.G. White who was co-founder vs. Evil between God and Satan as it is played out on Earth. She also delved into the End Time.

This current publication of The Great Controversy features a cover with the United States Capital Building and St. Peter's Basilica (upside down) along

with the Vatican Flag. The back cover specifically refers to John F. Kennedy, Pope John Paul II, Pope Francis (none of whom were alive at the time of White's original writing) and the Catholic Church. These specific references make it obvious that this publication is targeting the Catholic Church.



I was shocked (and offended) by the gross distortion White portrays of the Catholic Church. There are erroneous references to the Catholic Church uniting with Satan, worshiping images and relics, the teachings of the Church being based on deception, and the Pope as a "device of Satan" (page 380.)

In addition to attacks on the Papacy, White criticized the beauty that is found in sacred art. She stated that "they [images of sacred art] are often employed by Satan to lead man to forget the necessities of the soul...to turn away from [God]" (page 379.) The Catechism of the Catholic Church upholds that "sacred art is true and beautiful...evoking and glorifying, in faith and adoration, the transcendent mystery of God" (CCC 2502.)

White also condemned the Sacred Traditions and Rituals of the Church, claiming that the teachings of Christ are buried beneath a mass of senseless traditions. She even made a direct attack on the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Throughout the book White misrepresents the Catholic Church with statements like, "The Roman Catholic Church...uniting the forms of paganism and Christianity... misrepresenting the character of God...dignitaries of the [Catholic] church studied under Satan their master" (page 381.) She falsifies the character and mission of the Church from the Early Church though the current day (remember the book was written in the 1800's).

Finally, White's discussion on the End Time was alarming. It is important to understand that the Catechism of the Catholic Church specifically cautions against of the Seventh-Day Adventist Church. In this writing, she millenarianism, paragraph 676, "The Church has rejected discussed her interpretation of the cosmic battle of Good even modified forms of this falsification of the kingdom to come...especially the "intrinsically perverse" political form of a secular messianism." Sacred Scripture states that we do not know when the Son will come. "But of that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father alone, "Matthew 24:36.

> The falsehoods which White wove through her writing were innumerable. I have only mentioned a few here.





Deliverance from Exile

Fourth Sunday of Lent 2 Chronicles 36:14–16, 19–23

"What did I do to deserve this?" When misfortunes come our way, we instinctively suspect that God is punishing us for something. In truth, we often find out we are our own worst enemies, judging ourselves more harshly than God would. Our own bad habits, our own selfishness, and our own negligence come back to haunt us.

"What did I do to deserve this?" is the question residents of ancient Jerusalem asked when the city fell to the Assyrians and those who escaped death were carried captive to Babylon. The temple was destroyed, the city lay in ruins, and the people were made slaves. How did this happen?

God's chosen people had a lot of time to think over that question and find an answer. In captivity, they came to a spiritual awakening. They realized that they and their leaders had been unfaithful to the covenant and insincere in their worship. They believed that God was punishing them. But what did God do?

In time, God spoke to Cyrus, king of Persia, and commanded the ruler to free the people. They left their captivity, returned to Jerusalem, rebuilt the temple, and dedicated themselves anew to the sacred covenant.
