Journey of Faith Are You Interested in Becoming Catholic?

The Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception welcomes individuals or families who are interested in joining our Catholic faith community.

Year-Round Catechesis

Those who have already been baptized into another Christian community will prepare for reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church. The Rite of Reception will include Confirmation and First Communion. You may be received at any Sunday throughout the year after completing formation..

FORMATION We offer year-round formation. Participants attend Sunday Mass and regular formation sessions.

SEEKING BAPTISM

Those who have not been baptized will prepare for baptism through the RCIA, process which includes the periods of Precatechumenate, Catechumenate, Purification and Enlightenment, and Mystagogy. Baptism takes place at the Easter Vigil.

WHAT IS RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is modeled on the initiation ritual of the early Christian church. It is an experience of personal formation and spiritual growth which incorporates prayer, study, reflection, and discernment in a combination of public rituals and community preparations. It is the way unbaptized persons become Catholic.

FORMATION We offer year-round formation. Participants attend Sunday Mass, Breaking Open the Word, and regular formation sessions.

Breaking Open the Word takes place each week during Sunday Mass. During these sessions, you will discuss God's Word in the Sunday scripture readings and your personal journey of faith.

HOW DO I START THE PROCESS?

Whether you are baptized or unbaptized, the first step in this process is to fill out the RCIA Registration Form on our website, then I'll follow up with you to explain the rest of the process. **www.golddome.org**.



All Is New Easter Sunday Acts 10:34a, 37–43



- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street. You will need a <u>barcode</u>. The barcode is available on slips of paper at the Cathedral and on our<u>website</u>. The barcode changes every month.
- 2. To enter the garage, using paper or your phone, turn the barcode toward the electronic reader to raise the arm. You will also use it to exit.
- 3. The same barcode can be used throughout the month.
- 4. If an attendant is on duty, show your barcode and explain you are going to the Cathedral.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you may be directed to a different garage.
- 6. If riding a bike, you may park it in the vestibule.

DECREE Behold KC May 4, 2024 Vigil Mass

Whereas a first major outdoor Eucharistic Adoration event in Kansas City of thousands and thousands of the faithful occurred on the north terrace lawn of the Liberty Memorial on May 4, 1941, as a public proclamation of faith and Catholic belief as seen in the picture posted on beholdkc.org; and

Whereas the three-year National Eucharistic Revival sponsored by the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops concludes its parish year in 2024 following the diocesan year of 2023 prior to the national Eucharistic Revival gathering in July 2024 in Indianapolis, Indiana, which many local Catholics and friends cannot attend; and

Whereas the Diocese of Kansas City – Saint Joseph and the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas in partnering in this public, outdoor Eucharistic gathering on May 4, 2024 seek to worship the Holy Trinity through a 6:30 p.m. Mass followed by Eucharistic adoration; and

Whereas the Mass and adoration will be preceded and/or followed by nationally-recognized live musical talent, local musicians, confessions, and speaker(s); and

Whereas in consultation with both the Presbyteral Council members themselves and of those priests who joined our annual Priest Purgatorial Mass and luncheon on November 9, 2023, giving their assent to my inquiry; and

Whereas pastors of souls in the larger metropolitan area are duly encouraged to assist me as Ordinary of the Diocese of Kansas City – Saint Joseph in witnessing to our Catholic belief, encouraging fellow Catholics, while also demonstrating to all people of good will a large scale, peaceful gathering of unity in faith, hope and love; and

Whereas significant distance, particularly within our rural parishes, make transportation difficult, though admittedly not impossible; and

Whereas Archbishop of Kansas City in Kansas and I seek to replicate anew a similar gathering of worshippers and people praying;

I Hereby DECLARE

That all Saturday, May 4, 2024, Vigil Masses within Jackson, Clay and Platte Counties of Missouri, with the exception of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception Vigil Mass that is particularly frequented by conventioneers, hotel guests, and airline/medical personnel who cannot be alerted, are to be cancelled and priests and people invited to gather on the north terrace lawn of the Liberty Memorial prior to the 6:30 p.m. Mass and Eucharistic adoration. Additionally, pastors in other counties are likewise permitted, but not required, to cancel their Vigil Mass on the same date to facilitate their faithful of their parish and themselves likewise to participate with due consideration to the salvation of souls.
