
Vacation Bible School

- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street. You will need a <u>barcode</u>. The barcode is available on slips of paper at the Cathedral and on our<u>website</u>. The barcode changes every month.
- 2. To enter the garage, using paper or your phone, turn the barcode toward the electronic reader to raise the arm. You will also use it to exit.
- 3. The same barcode can be used throughout the month.
- 4. If an attendant is on duty, show your barcode and explain you are going to the Cathedral.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you may be directed to a different garage.
- 6. If riding a bike, you may park it in the vestibule.

The Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception welcomes individuals or families who are interested in joining our Catholic faith community.

Year-Round Catechesis

Those who have already been baptized into another Christian community will prepare for reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church. The Rite of Reception will include Confirmation and First Communion. You may be received at any Sunday throughout the year after completing formation..

FORMATION We offer year-round formation. Participants attend Sunday Mass and regular formation sessions.

SEEKING BAPTISM

Those who have not been baptized will prepare for baptism through the RCIA, process which includes the periods of Precatechumenate, Catechumenate, Purification and Enlightenment, and Mystagogy. Baptism takes place at the Easter Vigil.

WHAT IS RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is modeled on the initiation ritual of the early Christian church. It is an experience of personal formation and spiritual growth which incorporates prayer, study, reflection, and discernment in a combination of public rituals and community preparations. It is the way unbaptized persons become Catholic.

FORMATION We offer year-round formation. Participants attend Sunday Mass, Breaking Open the Word, and regular formation sessions.

Breaking Open the Word takes place each week during Sunday Mass. During these sessions, you will discuss God's Word in the Sunday scripture readings and your personal journey of faith.


HOW DO I START THE PROCESS?

What the Creator Never Created

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 1:13–15; 2:23–24



The Book of Wisdom says there are three things God did not make: death, destruction, and injustice. Yet we live with them every day.

Wisdom believes that God intended the world to be a much better place. We humans were made in the image of God, designed to be as imperishable as God is. God did not "make" death. God is good.

God also intended that the creatures of the world would be wholesome and that plants would provide nourishment and health—"not a destructive drug among them." In this view, God did not create violence among animals or poisons among drugs.

And God expected that justice would reign, because justice, like God, is undying. Justice is an expression of God's will. Everything that God made was good.

That is the view of the Book of Wisdom. But it isn't a picture of the world we live in. The Book of Wisdom knows why: "By the envy of the devil, death entered the world, and they who belong to his company experience it." The presence of evil, which was not precisely crelated by God according to this view, frustrated the designs of God's more perfect creation.

God did not create evil, but we know that evil exists and that death, destruction, and injustice abound. But we also believe they are not part of God's eternal plan and that those who belong to God's company will experience justice, salvation, and life everlasting.
