Parking Barcode for June

- Free parking is available in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street. You will need a <u>barcode</u>. The barcode is available on slips of paper at the Cathedral and on our<u>website</u>. The barcode changes every month.
- 2. To enter the garage, using paper or your phone, turn the barcode toward the electronic reader to raise the arm. You will also use it to exit.
- 3. The same barcode can be used throughout the month.
- 4. If an attendant is on duty, show your barcode and explain you are going to the Cathedral.
- 5. If the garage fills up, you may be directed to a different garage.
- 6. If riding a bike, you may park it in the vestibule.

Journey of Faith Are You Interested in Becoming Catholic?

The Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception welcomes individuals or families who are interested in joining our Catholic faith community.

Year-Round Catechesis

Those who have already been baptized into another Christian community will prepare for reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church. The Rite of Reception will include Confirmation and First Communion. You may be received at any Sunday throughout the year after completing formation..

FORMATION We offer year-round formation. Participants attend Sunday Mass and regular formation sessions.

SEEKING BAPTISM

Those who have not been baptized will prepare for baptism through the RCIA, process which includes the periods of Precatechumenate, Catechumenate, Purification and Enlightenment, and Mystagogy. Baptism takes place at the Easter Vigil.

WHAT IS RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is modeled on the initiation ritual of the early Christian church. It is an experience of personal formation and spiritual growth which incorporates prayer, study, reflection, and discernment in a combination of public rituals and community preparations. It is the way unbaptized persons become Catholic.


FORMATION We offer year-round formation. Participants attend Sunday Mass, Breaking Open the Word, and regular formation sessions.

Breaking Open the Word takes place each week during Sunday Mass. During these sessions, you will discuss God's Word in the Sunday scripture readings and your personal journey of faith.

HOW DO I START THE PROCESS?

Whether you are baptized or unbaptized, the first step in this process is to fill out the RCIA Registration Form on our website, then I'll follow up with you to explain the rest of the process. **www.golddome.org**.

THE BLOOD OF THE COVENANT

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Exodus 24:3–8

To drink the Blood of Christ is to perform a strong act of faith. Drinking human blood would be repulsive in any culture. But drinking divine blood is an act of faith.

Jesus specifically asked us to do this. "Take and drink," he said. "This is my blood." And, "If you do not drink my blood you have no life in you." Strong words.

Moses used blood as a sign of the covenant between Israel and God. After relating God's commands to the people, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the Lord has told us." Moses had some young men slaughter some young bulls as a peace offering. He sprinkled some of the blood on an altar. He sprinkled more of it on the people. Blood, the symbol of life, united the people with God in a committed covenant.

Moses told the people, "This is the blood of the covenant." Jesus told those gathered at the Last Supper, "This is the blood of the new and everlasting covenant."

When we drink the Blood of Christ, we drink the source of life. We make firm our com[Imitment with God. We say in our sip, "We will do everything that the Lord has told us."
