



SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 2 THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED (ALL SOULS)

While this is not a holy day of obligation, we are encouraged to pray for the dead. "Already back in the 2nd century, evidence exists that Christians prayed for and celebrated the Eucharist for their beloved dead. In the beginning, they would pray on the third day after burial, then on the anniversary. Later, the 7th and 30th day after death became days on which it became customary to pray for the deceased. Remembering the dead on the 2 November became official in the year 998 when Abbot Odilo of Cluny (994-1048) made it obligatory in all the monasteries subject to him. In 1915, Pope Benedict XV granted permission to priests to celebrate several Masses on this day. The liturgy proposes various Masses on this day, all of which are geared toward highlighting the Paschal Mystery, Jesus' victory over sin and death."



Parking Barcode for October



- 1. For Daily Mass, use any entrance. Entrance for weekend Masses is through the Bishop Hogan Center.
- 2. Free parking is available in our lot and in the parking garage east of Broadway on 12th Street. You will need a *barcode*. The barcode is available on slips of paper at the Cathedral and on our *website*. The barcode changes every month.
- 3. To enter the garage, using paper or your phone, turn the barcode toward the electronic reader to raise the arm. You will also use it to exit.
- 4. The same barcode can be used throughout the month.
- 5. If an attendant is on duty, show your barcode and explain you are going to the Cathedral.
- 6. If riding a bike, use the bike rack on the 12th Street side of our building.

The Desire for Wisdom

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 7:7–11




There are many things we can possess. Advertisers remind us of this hundreds of times every day. When we read the morning news, ads borrow the attention of our eyes. When we watch television, go to the movies, drive the highway, go to the ballgame, or pick up a program, we see the logos of merchants. These ads say they want us to be happy. But they really want us to shop.

Testimony from the Book of Wisdom speaks in favor of something else, though. The speaker asks for possessions but not for things. The speaker asks for prudence and a spirit of wisdom.

Many of us have other goals. We work hard at our job to earn what we need to pay for home and food. We work hard in school to earn the grades that win us a degree and the chance for a job. But the Book of Wisdom envisions something else. It envisions people working hard to learn God's wisdom first.

Throughout this past week, what did you shop for? What kind of possessions did you want to bring home? What sacrifices are you making to obtain what you desire?

Do you desire something deeper? Do you desire prudence? A spirit of wisdom? What sacrifices are you making to obtain those desires?
