Ambassadors for Christ

Fourth Sunday of Lent

2 Corinthians 5:17 - 21

Through the sacrament of Reconciliation we confess our sins and experience the mercy that God alone can give. Through the ministry of the church, we are reconciled to God and one another. The priest, our intermediary, expresses the forgiveness of God, represents the forgiving community, and steers the wandering ship of our souls to the safe shores of peace.

We believe that God created the earth in goodness. Sin entered the world, and God keeps us at peace through the ministry of reconciliation.

In a letter to the Corinthians, Paul says that he himself was reconciled to God through Christ and that he was given the ministry of reconciliation. God reconciled the world in Christ, and continued the work of reconciliation through Paul and other apostles, making them ambassadors of the forgiving Christ. On behalf of Christ, Paul pleads, "be reconciled to God."

As we become more aware of our faults this Lent, we bring our sorrow to the church through the sacrament of Reconciliation. Then, forgiven by Christ, we too become ambassadors for him. We carry the message of Reconciliation to all that we meet.

Lent is not just about seeking forgiveness for ourselves but also about building reconciliation wherever ties were broken. Wherever we can, let us bring the peace of Christ to all we meet at home, at work, at school, in our streets – all around the world.

En Chad, Claudine, una madre de seis niños, utiliza el préstamo de su SILC local para comprar a bajo costo grandes cantidades de los ingredientes necesarios para elaborar los buñuelos que ella vende en el mercado. Antes de que se estableciera SILC, Claudine apenas podía vender suficientes buñuelos para poder subsistir. Pero ahora, estos ahorros en los costos le permiten mantener a su familia y cubrir las matrículas escolares.

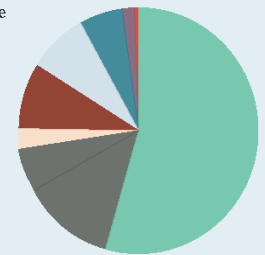
